Since 1996 the Castle Downs Recreation Society (CDRS) and the community leagues in Castle Downs have hosted a fun, family oriented celebration of Canada Day.

Canada Day 2015 was a huge success with a great turnout. It was sunny with some clouds and a high of about 27 degrees.

Elected officials brought greetings from the City of Edmonton (Councillors Dave Loken and Bev Esslinger), from the Province of Alberta (MLAs Nicole Goehring and David Eggen) and the Government of Canada (Brent Rathgeber). A simple translation of their words is "The CDRS and the leagues in Castle Downs show what community leadership is all about. What a great country we live in. Let the party continue."

Volunteers from the CDRS and the leagues make this event happen, along with our corporate supporter Albany RBC who helped supervise the hayride and handed out 1,600 freezies.

Baturyn's cotton candy team had a huge line up all day. Sticky fingers were everywhere and the sugar kept the kids going.

The four "Balloon Fairies" from Caernarvon frantically assembled balloon animals and figures all day long - and they really did look like fairies with their great outfits. Carlisle's glitter tattoo artists put a lot of sparkle on hundreds and hundreds of kids. The CDRS's face painter was a great hit as always.

Dunluce's and Lorelei's jumpy tents let the kids burn off lots of energy. Cumberland-Oxford's Photo Booth was a hit again and the photographer said it was one of the most hectic events he has ever done. The CDRS popcorn booth served over 1,000 bags of popcorn.

Each year the CDRS brings a hayride to take people between the YMCA parking lot and the playground/waterpark. This is a lot of fun for kids and families.



A team of volunteers from Carlisle managed the parking lot to ensure parking was orderly and safe for people coming and going.

Once again, the Seahawks Football Club ran a tremendous BBQ for the crowd.

Thanks to the Castle Downs Family YMCA for providing tables and chairs for the event.

Thanks to the Pacific Island Dancers for being the opening act to the program and for continuing to dance after the program.

Finally, a thank you to Constable Jacqueline Buchanan and Sgt Curtis Hoople from the Edmonton Police Service - their presence helps with the crowd and also lets them be "ambassadors." Sgt Hoople shot some "hoops" with the kids on the basketball court.

Canada Day is an event that builds a great community - the full diversity of the community comes to this event and everyone sees that "Kids and families smile in the same language."



Health Link phone number

More Albertans using 811 than the old number.

Just weeks after the launch of Health Link's new 811 phone number, more Albertans are dialling 811 for health information and advice.

Call statistics show just two weeks after the number was announced, 66 per cent of callers were using the number in place of the old 10 digit numbers. Health Link is Alberta Health Services' free, 24/7 health information and advice line. This province-wide service helps callers by providing at-home treatment options and information on the most appropriate health care services.. 811 replaces the existing local numbers in Calgary and Edmonton as well as the provincewide toll-free number. The old numbers will continue to direct callers to Health Link for the time being. In a medical emergency, Albertans should continue to dial 911 or visit the nearest emergency department.
