





Federal Government Plan to "Close Tax Loopholes" Negatively Targets Small Businesses

On July 18, Minister of Finance Bill Morneau announced his intention to close tax loopholes that allow wealthy Canadians to avoid higher tax rates.

The proposed measures include closing the loophole of business owners "sprinkling" their total income among family members who sit in lower income tax brackets; taxpayers using private corporations as a substitute for a regular savings account; and taxpayers converting a private corporation's regular income into capital gains. The government is launching a 75-day public consultation on the proposed measures.

While I agree that Canada's tax system should be fair, I am concerned that the proposed changes may negatively impact hardworking small and medium-sized business owners who play by the rules and create jobs in our communities.

While I believe that the tax system should be fair and equitable, I also believe that we should support policies that reduce the tax burden for small and medium-sized businesses, reduce government red tape and allow entrepreneurs to create jobs in their communities.

Of course, all Canadians participate in some sort of tax planning, for example, by making RRSP contributions at the end of the fiscal year. But if the government moves forward with this plan to change the tax system for small businesses, the entire economy will suffer. Small businesses are the backbone of our economy.

These proposed amendments are egregious with many implications reaching further than the government have the foresight to see. I fail to see how targeting Canadians that risk everything to run their small businesses is a good idea. After all, these are the people that keep our communities running.

My colleagues and I will be participating in the consultation process to ensure that the voices of hardworking business owners are heard. We know that tax hikes are making it more difficult for entrepreneurs to maintain and grow their businesses. And we also know Justin Trudeau's position on small and medium-sized businesses. During the election campaign, Trudeau stated that a "significant proportion" of small businesses serve as a screen for wealthy Canadians who want to avoid paying taxes. I find this insulting.

Back to school safety



Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students about some road safety tips, as streets become more congested, with the return of the school year. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play road safety is a shared responsibility.

Motorists

- Avoid talking on cell phones, texting, or any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving;
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner:
- Remember, it is illegal to pass vehicles - other than those that are parked - in school zones or playground zones, during posted

Around school buses

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop - motorists should do likewise;
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP, when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights - unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you;
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

Pedestrians

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions;
- Make eve contact with all drivers before crossing the street, and keep distractions to a minimum;
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete stop
- Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the roadway;
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing;
- Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian





Locked up Tight and Out of Sight: Safer Homes, Safer Kids

Every year in Alberta, more than 1600 children under the age of 10, visit emergency departments as a result of accidental poisoning. Most of these events involve the unintended ingestion of medications.

Alberta's Poison and Drug Information Service (PADIS) receives over 13,000 calls per year concerning accidental exposure to poisons by children in this age group.

Many, if not most, accidental medication poisonings could be prevented by following a few simple steps to make your home safer for your children and small visitors.

- Always keep prescription and over-the-counter medications locked up tight, out of sight, and in their original containers.
- Be aware that child-resistant caps on medication bottles can make it more difficult for a child to open a bottle but they ARE NOT childproof.
- When taking medications, do it away from children. Children often copy the actions of their parents.
- Guests, family or friends may bring their medications into your home. Always ensure purses, backpacks and coats are in a safe place, out of children's reach.
- Put the PADIS emergency number in your cellular phones and/or display the number near your land-line telephone.
- If you have a poisoning emergency call PADIS at 1-800-332-1414.

Giving people a voice in mental health research

The Mental Health Commission of Canada reports that in a given year, one in five people in Canada experiences a mental health problem or illness. In Alberta, that's more than 675,000 people.

Researchers and clinicians in the province recognize the need to learn more about mental health, but realize most research topics are chosen by the researcher, not the people living with mental illness. A new study partly funded by Alberta Innovates (previously Alberta Innovates – Health Solutions) is changing that. This fall, the Alberta Depression Research Priority Setting Project surveyed people who have experienced depression, as well as their clinicians and caregivers, to pinpoint gaps in current research.

"Someone with lived experience will likely have a different perspective than someone doing the research," explains Robbie Babins-Wagner, PhD, a professor at the University of Calgary Faculty of Social Work and a member of the project's advisory group.

WHY 30 AT JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS?

As of September 6, 2017, school zones are in effect around elementary and junior high schools throughout Edmonton. Motorists are required to slow down to 30 km/h between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. (08:00 – 16:30) on school days where school zone signs are posted.

Hospice, One of Many Options for End-of-life Care

In Alberta, there are many options to get palliative and end of life care—your home, a hospital, a continuing care centre, or a hospice.

Hospices are places made to feel like home while giving specialized end of life care, 24/7.

The care teams focus on comfort and quality of life, and can help patients and their family cope with feelings about serious illness.

In a hospice, palliative care is provided by health professionals, volunteers, and spiritual counsellors. Services include:

- managing pain
- helping with daily living activities (personal care)
- -emotional, psychological and spiritual support.

Before accessing palliative care or a hospice, a health care team discusses with patients on what's important to them and where they would like to be at the time of their illness where they may either have: a life expectancy of less than 3 months; signed a form saying they do not want to be resuscitated or a need to be in a bed or chair most of the time.

A patient's choice may change as an illness changes, and individuals can get palliative and end of life care at any time.

There's also a new program that's helping to bring emergency care to people who get palliative and end of life care in their homes.

The EMS Assess, Treat, Refer program has Emergency Medical Services, home care clinicians, doctors, and families working together to help people stay in their homes if that's what they wish.

Advance Care Planning

We may all experience a time when someone we love has an accident, injury or disease that takes away their ability to speak for themselves. When that happens, would you or your loved ones know what they wanted for care?

It's important to have a will in case of death, but it's also important to have an advance care plan so loved ones know what you want and take the guess work out for your healthcare team if it was needed.

Yes, it's an awkward conversation for many, but a very important one to have. Anyone over the age of 18 may want to consider having an advance care plan, as it's not just for people who have already had something tragic happen; it's for every adult.

Take the guess work out. Take control of the conversation. Take action on your care wishes.
