



#### Keep active during winter time

Here are some fun facts about winter walking.

On average, Edmonton has 325 days a year with some bright sunshine and is considered the third sunniest city in Canada. Walking outdoors in all that sunlight will help your body's production of Vitamin D and the physical activity can help to increase our body's production of endorphins, which naturally makes us feel better!

While everyone seems to have a great memory about it being -40 for two months straight the facts are something quite different The 1961-1990 average daily temp in Janu-

ary was -12.5. From 1971 – 2000, the average daily temp

in January was -11.7

From 1981- 2010, the average daily temperature in January was -10.4

Dressing for any winter activity is all about layering your clothing. If you are planning to walk a good distance, remember that it is important that your first layer (base layer) wicks moisture away from your skin.

Winter walking surface conditions can change daily and even by the hour! Walking poles or ski poles and slip on studded winter grips for your boots are the simplest way to ensure better footing! Ask at your local sports store and even some hardware and department stores now carry these items!

### Have you made a New Year's resolution and want to make it a habit?

You're not alone. Every year, people set goals wanting to change their lifestyle.

To get into action, the first step is to jot down ideas for changes you want to make. From this list, pick one that you feel ready to start. Then make it a SMART goal.

Deciding to lose weight is a goal that many people choose. To make it a SMART goal, focus on behaviour you will do every day, instead of the outcome (weight loss).

Using the SMART guidelines can help you to set a goal that is within reach. Changing too many things at once can be overwhelming. To make lasting changes, work on what you can stick with. A SMART goal example is packing a lunch that includes vegetables at least three days of the week.

Once you've set your goals, think about what might prevent you from achieving

your goals. This can help you plan ways to get around barriers. For example, if your goal is to pack a lunch that includes vegetables, your barrier may be that your weeknights are always busy and this prevents you from cutting up vegetables. To work around this barrier, you could wash and cut up vegetables on Sunday night and pack them for the week. It takes a bit of planning, but a little thought and time up front will help you achieve your goal.

Remember to reward yourself and to monitor your progress. Celebrate when you stick to your goal for a month. If your plan isn't working, take time to ask yourself why, and adjust the plan so you can make it happen.
