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A little time in the Garden

Where a great many of us are tending to our newly planted garden beds and pampering our outdoor arrangements, our indoor plants are chomping at the bit to get going. Tis the season for exponential growth and for some genus, even breaking through their pots as if they had been fertilized with rocket fuel!! Well, our plants know what's up. It's time to re-pot! Spring and summer are the best times to repot, divide or otherwise disturb our houseplants. Our plant friends are nearing their peak active growth period for the year so they are better able to bounce back should they experience any root disturbance during re-potting.

When re-potting, here are some tips to remember:

Don't overshoot - As a general rule, you should go up by 1 or 2 pot sizes each time vou re-pot. Depending on the genus and their growth speed, that may differ. You can re-pot throughout the year, spring/summer is just preferable.

Roots - It's probably common knowledge, but worth mentioning; avoid disturbance and damaging of the root. If there are any broken or damaged roots as a result of re-potting, remove damaged pieces. If damage is extensive you can try dipping the ends in cinnamon. Cinnamon helps to prevent rot. Like sulfur, cinnamon is a natural fungicide that helps most plants root, while inhibiting the spores that cause rot. If you notice any root rot while re-potting; remove

rotten pieces, spray with hydrogen peroxide and dip in cinnamon.

Water your plant - If you have re-potting planned in advance, keep hydration in mind. A couple days before you plan to re-pot, give

your friend a thorough drink. This reduces the risk of shock.

Soil – This is the ideal time to replenish your soil. If it's been a few seasons since replacing your soil, it may be time to replace altogether.

If it's only been a year or so, you can simply add amendments and nutrients that have been depleted or washed away. The type of soil mix will depend on your plant. My favorite mix is good quality potting soil, some perlite and some fine orchid bark (worm castings are also a great addition). I find that this will satisfy MOST (but not all) plants.

Research your specific plant and it's native growth habitat.
