Traffic Safety Tips

First one I wanted to talk about is Posted Stop Signs. There is a myth out there that you have to stop and count to three. This is not correct. When pulling up to a Posted Stop Sign with a marked line across the roadway or a marked cross walk you must stop before the line or the crosswalk. If no marked line or marked crosswalk then stop no more than 3m from the edge of the intersecting roadway. Stopping means that your wheels/tires have come to a complete stop. The vehicle motion has ceased. You put other motorists including pedestrians and yourself in danger when you do not come to a complete stop. Rolling stops are not the same. Violation Ticket for not stopping at a Stop Sign has a penalty of \$388.00 and 3 demerit points. After your vehicle has come to a complete stop – then and only then – proceed when safe to do so yielding the right of way to all vehicles and pedestrians.

I encourage drivers to routinely do a walk around of their vehicles. Check your lights, tire pressures and even your license plate. I have noticed a lot of vehicles lately with daylight running lights out, brake lights out including the top centre one most drivers forget to check and driving on tires with near low tire pressure that is extremely dangerous as it affects the vehicle's ability to steer and brake properly. Checking your license plate will remind you when to register your vehicle or if you have forgotten to put your new sticker. Doing a quick walk around daily can save you from being pulled over and receiving violation tickets and or being towed. Last note please take a look at your drivers license and check expiry date.

Parking Safety Tip

Please be mindful when parking near marked crosswalks. Under the Traffic Safety Act you must not park on or across and within 5 Meters from near side (the side of a vehicle that is opposite the driver's side and close to the curb) which is before the crosswalk. Penalty under Traffic Safety Act is \$78.00 and most municipalities including Edmonton have this section under their bylaws and penalties start at \$50.00. Vehicle can also be towed at owner's expense. Parking within 5 meters blocks visibility of pedestrians trying to cross the road.

The parking within 5 meters applies to Stop and Yield signs as well as fire hydrants.

PET SAFETY TIPS

Under Edmonton's City Bylaw #13145 Dogs are not allowed to be out of control off owners property. What that means is your dog must be on a leash not exceeding two meters in length and be in control of the dog when not on your property. Exceptions are when you are in an off leash area. Keep dogs 10 metres away from school grounds, playgrounds, sports fields and picnic sites. This helps keep your dog, other dog owners and people safe from unpredictable events that can happen.

Reminder all dogs in the City of Edmonton need to be licensed yearly and have their license tag displayed on their collar when it's off your property. Please be a responsible pet owner and carry a bag and clean up any defecation your dog may do off your property. On your property please keep the defecation to a minimum to eliminate the smell and unsightly look to your fellow neighbors. Tickets may be issued if your property and being out of control of the owner. Fines start at \$100 dollars and go up from there for these offences. I hope everyone is enjoying your Spring/Summer thus far. School will be out soon and there will be more children and youth's out on our streets and in our playgrounds. Please do your part and obey the traffic and parking laws to help keep everyone safe. Reminder to check all your documents with regards to driving which include your Driver's license, Insurance and Registration to make sure all is valid and in your vehicle or on your person. Please walk around and check your vehicles daily. Distracted driving does include when you are at a red light. Only use hands free devices while driving or risk getting a Violation Ticket for \$287 dollars and 3 demerit points.

Sunglasses – more than just a fashion statement

Sunglasses are a "must have" for big-sky prairie summers and there is more to think about when selecting them than style and cost.

Sunglasses can protect your eyes from the harmful effects of ultraviolet (UV) light and can dramatically reduce the risk of damage to your eyes. In the same way your skin can be damaged by UV rays, your eyes can also be affected by the sun. Prolonged exposure can cause permanent eye damage and is a contributing factor in many eye disorders, like cataracts, macular degeneration and ophthalmic cancers.

The best UV protection is offered by close-fitting wraparound sunglasses, so glasses should fit closely to your face and wrap around the face.

It's important to read the label when selecting sunglasses, as different types of lenses protect your eyes from different types of light. Look for sunglasses or prescription lenses with full UVA and UVB protection – like those that are labelled as 'UV400' or '100% UV protection.' Dark lenses don't necessarily block out more UV light than lighter lenses but it's still important to choose a pair that are dark enough to keep your eyes comfortable in bright sunlight. Keep in mind that contact lenses, even those with UV protection, don't provide full coverage for the eye and skin around the eye.

It's especially important to protect your eyes when the sun's rays are most intense – between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. In addition to wearing sunglasses, it's also a good idea to wear a wide-brimmed hat to protect skin and eyes.

Be sun-wise and take steps to protect your eyes.
