Sport Explorerz - the Power to Move Kids



The north Edmonton community leagues of *Kilkenny, Horse Hill, McLeod, Northmount, Evansdale, and Lago Lindo* have joined forces to run the Sport Explorerz program to help 3-5-year-old children acquire and practice basic movement and sports skills in a fun and engaging way.

It's the perfect pre-sports program and you can take it within your community.

Let's face it... most 3-5-year-olds just want to have fun! Sport Explorerz is not a sport, but rather a fun way to get an active start in physical activity in ways that enhance coordination, foster new social skills and build confidence by engaging in fun physical activities. Children will learn fundamental skills that will serve them in multiple sports. Active Start and Fundamentals are the physical literacy stages of the Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD) model across all sports (canadiansportforlife.ca). In short, children will learn the skill fundamentals that will help them be successful in any sport and help encourage them to start today on an active lifestyle that will last a lifetime.

Sport Explorerz is led by trained leaders in a way that will give all kids the "power to move" in sport and in life.

Wanted: Coaches and Female Soccer Players

Our biggest challenge every year has been to find coaches, but the bottom line is if we have no coach we can't have a team. It's especially hard in the younger age groups where both players and parents are new to the program and parents are reluctant to get involved as they've never done it before.

Evansdale will pay for coaching clinics available from EMSA to teach you the basics. It takes a tremendous amount of time to phone all the parents on each team and try to talk a parent into coaching. If we don't have a coach in place by the end of the last registration then we will not be creating a team. We had some success last year with parents getting a relative or friend that was knowledgeable about the game to step up and take on the coaching duties for them, so that is an option as well!

Let me tell you from personal experience that it is easier to start at the younger ages than to start at the older levels with no experience. For those players that have quit playing, a good enjoyable way to stay in the game is to get into coaching and mentoring a team just as someone had done for you when you were playing.

I will meet anyone interested in coaching at anytime to discuss what is involved and what supports are available. I will also be at the hall on Wednesday August 16 to meet with anyone interested.

Female Soccer Players

Like most other northend communities, we are seeing a large decline in female soccer players. If you know of any girls that would like to play, please encourage them to register. We also need females to coach and mentor them as well. We would like to have our U8 girls have a girls team rather than be required to play with the boys on a mixed team because of insufficient female players. We also require female coaches, especially on these all-girl teams that wouldn't require a male coach (mixed teams require a male and female coach).

Just a reminder that you are allowed to play in any community you want but you must first register on-line via your community and attend your communities registration session before you can be transferred to the community of your choice.

I will be at the hall on on Wednesday August 16 to help anyone having problems with the on-line registration only. Please tell all your friends of these dates who are thinking of registering their kids to play as we will not be as lenient with late registrations as last year. There is funding available through Jumpstart (http://www.kidsportcanada.ca/) and Kidsport (http://www.kidsportcanada.ca/).

Registration Process

- 1. Register online in the EMSA Soccer Portal (https://emsasoccerportal.com). If you have played in the last 2 years you will have an account; new players must create an account.
- 2. Print two copies of the player summary confirmation and bring them to registration. This printed copy will give you the date and address of the registration. If you can't print the player summary, then ensure the player summary confirmation email is in your inbox on your mobile device.
- 3. Attend your home community's registration session to purchase a community membership (if necessary), sign up for a volunteer commitment, and pay your soccer registration fees.
- 4. Please bring government ID to verify the player's date of birth.
- 5. Proof of address is required or a piece of mail with your Evansdale address on it.
- 6. A signed but un-dated cheque is required to secure each volunteer service such as bingos, casinos, community events, and ENZSA.
- 7. Please complete the on-line registration as soon as possible so we can get a general idea of the number of players we have. If you have any problems registering on the soccer portal there is an instructional video or e-mail me at soccer@evansdale.ca and I will walk you through the process.
- 8. If you are wanting to transfer to another community, we advise to register as early as possible as we have had some communities reject transfers because their programs are full.
- 9. Deposits for uniforms will be taken when the uniforms are handed out.



Ask Charles

I hired a real estate professional to sell my home. The seller representation agreement (listing agreement) I signed is for four months. It's only been two months, but I want to terminate the agreement, can I?

The short answer is yes, but it can be complicated.

The agreement you signed is a legal contract between you and a real estate brokerage to sell your home. It contains a start date and an end date, as well as provisions for ending the agreement early.

If you and your real estate professional agree in writing to end the agreement before the end date, the agreement immediately ends.

If you change your mind about selling your home and your real estate professional agrees to end the agreement early, you may be responsible for reimbursing your real estate professional for reasonable expenses they incurred while your property was for sale. Those potential expenses need to be listed on the agreement when



you sign it; your real estate professional can't add them after the fact. These expenses may include, but aren't limited to, reimbursement of advertising, measurement, or photography costs.

But, what happens when you want to end your agreement early and your real estate professional doesn't agree?

If you want to end your agreement early because you want to work with a different real estate brokerage, there could be consequences. For example, if you begin working with another real estate brokerage, and your property sells, your first real estate brokerage could make a claim that commissions are payable to them since the brokerage didn't agree to release you from the obligations of your agreement. You could find yourself owing commission to two brokerages.

Think carefully about why you want to end your agreement early. If it's because you genuinely changed your mind about selling, perhaps your employment situation changed, be open and upfront with your real estate professional.

You won't be the first seller who has a change of heart or financial circumstances, but your real estate brokerage is under no requirement to release you from your agreement.

Another possibility is that your real estate professional may agree to a conditional termination of your agreement. Conditional terminations typically require the seller to agree in writing that they won't re-list their property for sale with another real estate brokerage before the end of their original agreement.

If you want to end your agreement early because you and your real estate professional are not working well together or you have concerns about their performance, RECA encourages you to speak to their broker.





McLeod Community Service Policy

*This policy applies to soccer, baseball, softball, hockey, and Sport Explorerz registrations.

At the time of sports registration, you have two options for fulfilling your community service to the community league. Community service assists McLeod with raising funds to maintain the hall and to run programs. Community service options are not refundable whether your child plays or not. There are no exceptions to this (injury, illness included).

If you have one child in sports, it is \$150 (one community service option). If you have two children or more in sports, it is \$300 (two community service options). Note that two people cannot share one community service option.

There are two ways for you to fulfill your community service:

1. BUY-OUT OPTION

Purchase WEM tickets (10 for \$150) or other tangible item (if available). Payment for these can be made with your sports registration. If you are registering two or more children, you can choose a buy-out option and a work option.

2. WORK OPTION

Sign up to work a bingo, casino (if available) or McLeod event. You will need to provide an undated but signed cheque addressed to "McLeod Community League" for each option.

The date and time of your bingo(s)/casino/ event is written on your registration form. You are responsible for noting the date and time and ensuring you attend. Reminders may be sent as a courtesy but it is your responsibility to know when and where your work option is taking place. You cannot make up missed work options.

It is your responsibility to attend your work option. Your cheque is returned to you at the bingo/casino/event. If you fail to show up, your cheque will be cashed, no exceptions

If a bingo/casino/event is cancelled, you will be given options to fulfill your community service – another bingo/casino/event or buy-out option.

Any bounced cheques will result in a \$50 fee assessed. If you do not pay out your missed work option (plus any NSF fee), your child will be withdrawn from the sports program and you will not be able to purchase a membership or register in any McLeod sports or programs until the amount is paid in full.



McLeod Community Safety Director

The Alberta Traffic Safety calendar's focus for August is Impaired Driving.

Impaired driving is operating or care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired by alcohol or a drug. Charges can range from a 24 hour driver's license suspension to 5 years driver's license suspension and/or criminal charges which can lead to jail time. Subsequently your vehicle may be towed and impounded. Please plan ahead by booking a hotel, having a designated driver, calling a taxi or taking public transit.

Home Safety

Corded window coverings such as blinds are a hazard for children. The cords can cause strangulation and even death. The cords should be kept out of reach at all times. Always follow manufacturers' instructions when installing and using the blinds. It is recommended to buy cordless window coverings which more and more retailers are starting to sell in Canada.

Carbon Monoxide and Smoke detectors should be installed on every level of your home. Carbon monoxide detectors should be installed away from fresh air vents. Carbon Monoxide and Smoke detectors should be checked once a month to ensure they are working. Carbon Monoxide detectors should have an expiry date on them. Replace when expired.

Hot Water tanks should be set to no more than 49° C (120° F) on the temperature control. This will help prevent anyone getting scalded by unexpected hot water.

Before nodding off to sleep here are some things to check to ensure you stay safe.

- Check all exterior doors to ensure locked. I recommend you install deadbolts on your exterior doors if you haven't done so yet.
- Close and lock windows that are near ground level or that are easily reachable for a person to climb into
- Make sure if stove or oven was being used that switches are turned off
- Ensure candles or cigarette butts are out
- Ensure car doors are locked and valuables are not displayed. Garage door openers should not be kept in vehicles.

If you are new to the EMSA soccer program, please go to the EMSA North website at www. emsanorth.com to create your EMSA Soccer account and register for the upcoming season. The EMSA Soccer Portal is compatible with your smartphone, tablet and home computer. While online registration is mandatory, online payment is optional and you are encouraged to pay at McLeod hall at one of our registration dates noted above.

Please bring to McLeod's payment session, one signed copy of the player registration summary form, identification for proof of birthdate, payment (cash/credit/debit – cheques are not accepted as payment for soccer registration), an un-dated but signed cheque for volunteer commitments and Kidsport/Jumpstart applications if applicable.

Community memberships expire August 31st. All community members holding a 2016/17 McLeod membership will be able to exchange their existing membership card for a new one.

For those new to indoor soccer, U6 and U8 play Saturday mornings at the soccer facility on Victoria trail. U10 and U12 play throughout the day on Saturday at any of the 3 Edmonton soccer facilities. U14 to U18 play throughout the day on Sundays at any of the 3 Edmonton soccer facilities.

We will have socks, shin pads, and shorts available for sales for first time players and for those who have outgrown their current apparel.

What is the Proper Soccer Registration Process in McLeod?

There is a misconception that parents must attend the registration session of the community they'd like their child to play in if it's a community other than their home community. The EMSA Soccer Portal has been designed to capture a requested community to play in along with friend or coach request. The portal will automatically place an entry in a transfer queue for both the home and requested communities to approve. The home community approves the transfer out, followed by the requested community approving the transfer in. It is recommended parents attend a community league's first registration session to provide the best opportunity to be placed on their desired team.

Below are the general guidelines for registering for community soccer.

- 1) Register online in the EMSA Soccer Portal.
- 2) Print two copies of the player summary confirmation. If you can't print the player summary, then ensure the player summer confirmation email is in your inbox on your mobile device.
- 3) Attend your home community's registration session to purchase a community membership (if necessary), sign up for a volunteer commitment, and pay your soccer registration fees.
- 4) Be prepared to show government id to verify the player's date of birth.
- 5) A signed but undated cheque may be required to secure volunteer commitments such as bingos, casinos, community events, ENZSA events.
- 6) Determine your community's valid payment methods. McLeod's valid payment methods are cash, credit and debit. Other communities may accept cheques.

If you are looking to transfer to another community to play for the upcoming season, it is highly recommended you attend your community's first registration session to complete your registration and ensure the Soccer Director is aware of your intentions. This will provide a higher degree of certainty your transfer will be successful.




On March 21, 2017 we had our AGM and a new board has been elected but we are still have a need for new members to join and take on some positions.
