Ask Charles

I saw an ad saying a real estate professional will buy my house if it's not sold in 90 days. Should I be wary?

Wary might not be the best word, but you do need to make sure you understand the details of the offer. This type of offer is a guaranteed sales agreement, and while there is nothing illegal or wrong with a real estate company offering this kind of arrangement, it is rarely the best option for consumers.

In a guaranteed sales agreement, a real estate brokerage agrees to buy a piece of real estate from a seller at a previously agreed upon price, if it hasn't sold to someone else before a certain date. Only real estate brokerages can offer these agreements, not individual real estate professionals.

If you're selling your home to buy another one, you may be interested in a guaranteed sales agreement for the home you own now. It could help you avoid owning two homes and paying two mortgages. A guaranteed sales agreement might give you the confidence to proceed with your new home purchase before selling your current one.

What sellers need to keep in mind in these arrangements is that the real estate brokerage wants to minimize its risk.

For example, it's rare that a guaranteed purchase price will be based on the property's listing price or the property's market value. In most cases, the brokerage calculates the guaranteed purchase price using a formula where legal fees, carrying cost, and commission on the resale are subtracted from the purchase price. This minimizes the brokerage's risk, but it can also greatly reduce how much that seller receives for their home.

Brokerages that offer guaranteed sales programs are required to have policies for those programs. Those policies should include how the brokerage sets the guaranteed sales price and who is in control of the property's listing price during the listing period; it may not be the seller. It's not unusual for a guaranteed sales agreement to include a clause that requires a seller to lower their listing price during the term of the listing. Remember, your real estate brokerage wants to minimize its risk. It prefers to sell your property to a buyer rather than to use the guaranteed sales agreement, and lowering the listing price can sometimes help that happen.

If your real estate brokerage offers you a guaranteed sale agreement, it's up to you to decide whether you're interested. Before you do, make sure you read and understand all of the fine print.

DRAINAGE FOR BELLE RIVE FIRST PLACE SITE - Home drainage concerns have been identified on the City land adjacent to the Belle Rive First Place site. The City and the home builder are diligently working together to resolve these issues before the end of winter 2016, which would allow for design engagement to begin in 2017.

The first place program, which started in 2006, provided homes for first-time buyers on 20 vacant school sites in Edmonton. One of these chosen sites is located in Belle Rive. These homes are affordable for first-time buyers because the land cost is deferred for five years. Homes must be owner-occupied during that time period (i.e. no rental).

The design engagement will include representatives from the City, Evansdale community league, home builder, and a small group of interested Belle Rive residents.

The home builder is working on several innovative designs that will be brought forward for discussion as part of the design engagement process. The home builder is also working with the City to explore opportunities to retain existing trees on the building site. If some trees needs to be relocated or removed, it will be done strictly following guidelines under City of Edmonton's "Tree Policy".

Just a reminder that you are allowed to play in any community you want but you must first register on-line via your community and attend your community's registration session before you can be transferred to the community of your choice.

I will be at the hall on Wednesday January 25 from 7-9pm to help anyone having problems with the on-line registration only. We will not be as lenient with late registrations as last year so please get your registrations on time and tell all your friends!

Registration Process

4.

1. Register online in the EMSA Soccer Portal. If you have played in the past year and a half, you will have an account. New players must create an account.

2. Print two copies of the player summary confirmation and bring them to registration. If you can't print the player summary, then ensure the player summary confirmation email is in your inbox on your mobile device.

3. Attend your home community's registration session to purchase a community membership (if necessary), sign up for a volunteer commitment, and pay your soccer registration fees.

Please bring government ID to verify the player's date of birth.

5. Proof of address is required - driver's ID or a piece of mail with your Evansdale address on it.

6. A signed but undated cheque is required to secure each volunteer service such as bingos, casinos, community events, and ENZSA.

Please complete the on-line registration as soon as possible so we can get a general idea of the number of players we have. If you have any problems registering on the soccer portal there is an instructional video or e-mail me at soccer@evansdale.ca and I will walk you through it. Furthermore, if you are wanting to transfer to another community, it is advisable to register as early as possible.

WANTED : Coaches with Community Spirit!

Our biggest challenge each year has been to find coaches - and the bottom line is - if we have no coach, we can't have a team! It's especially hard in the younger age groups where both players and parents are new to the program and parents are reluctant to get involved as they've never done it before.

Evansdale will pay for coaching clinics available from EMSA to teach you the basics. It takes a tremendous amount of time to phone all the parents on each team and try to talk a parent into coaching.

If we don't have a coach in place by the end of the last registration then we will not be creating a team. We had some success last year with parents getting a relative or friend that was knowledgeable about the game to step up and take on the coaching duties for them so that is an option as well.

Let me tell you from personal experience that it is easier to start at the younger ages than to start at the older levels with no experience. For those players that have quit playing, a good enjoyable way to stay in the game is to get into coaching and mentoring a team just as someone had done for you when you were playing.

I will meet anyone interested in coaching at anytime to discuss what is involved and what supports are available. I will also be at the hall from 7 - 9pm on February 8th to meet with anyone interested in coaching.

Also Seeking Female Soccer Players and Coaches

We are, like most other North End communities, seeing a large decline in female soccer players. If you know of any girls that would like to play, please encourage them to register.

We also need females to coach and mentor them as well. We would like to have our U8 girls have a girls team rather than be forced to play with the boys on a mixed team. We also require female coaches, especially on these all -girl teams that wouldn't require a male coach (mixed teams require a male and female coach)

Rules for McLeod Rinks

- Skaters under the age of 18 must wear helmets while on rinks and on ice paths.
- No inappropriate behavior or language permitted.
- No alcohol or illegal drugs permitted.
- Clean up any mess you make, use the garbage cans, put empty beverage containers into the recycling bins.
- No playing tag or British Bulldog on rinks.
- No playing hockey or stick handling of pucks on any of the ice paths that lead to the rinks.

• No playing on the snow piles or ice surfaces inside the fenced rink area – this facility is for skating only.

• Report any problems to the rink attendant.

Failure to follow the rules will result in skaters being asked to leave the rink. Continued disregard will result in a complete ban. If you appear intoxicated, you will be asked to leave. Please respect your facility. Skate at your own risk.

McLeod Community League Rink Use Policy

McLeod maintains two ice rinks during the winter for community enjoyment. The rinks are open to the McLeod community league members, other community league members and the general public. As McLeod pays for the cost of the rink attendant and rink maintenance, we charge a nominal fee to non-community league members to assist in offsetting the operational costs.

> Fee: \$2.00 cash per visit payable to the rink attendant

Free: With the purchase of a McLeod Community League s i n g l e / f a m ily membership (cash only) from the rink attendant, you will receive skate tags accordingly. Af-

fix the skate tag to your skates and skating is free for the entire season.

If you are from another community league, please show your current membership and/ or your skate tag(s).

If you do not have your community league membership with you, please pay the nominal \$2.00 fee per skater. You will need to ensure you connect with your own community league to get skate tags to avoid paying the fee each time to access our rinks. The rink attendant does not have the discretion to waive the fee.

Receipts are available upon request from the rink attendant.

Access:

1. The BIG rink is for shinny.

2. The SMALL rink is primarily for public skating.

3. The SMALL rink may be partitioned for dual use – shinny and public skating.

4. There is no blanket schedule for either rink.5. Team practices are not permitted. Rinks

are not available for rental. 6. Usage of the rinks is determined on a nightto-night basis by the rink attendant.

Proper Registration Process for McLeod Soccer

There is a misconception that parents must attend the registration session of the community they'd like their child to play in if it's a community other than their home community.

The EMSA Soccer Portal has been designed to capture a requested community to play in along with friend or coach request. The portal will automatically place an entry in a transfer queue for both the home and requested community's to approve. The home community approves the transfer out, followed by the requested community approving the transfer in.

It is recommended parents attend a community league's first registration session to provide the best opportunity to be placed on their desired team.

Below are the general guidelines for registering for community soccer.

1) Register online in the EMSA Soccer Portal.

2) Print two copies of the player summary confirmation. If you can't print the player summary, then ensure the player summary confirmation email is in your inbox on your mobile device.

3) Attend your home community's registration session to purchase a community membership (if necessary), sign up for a volunteer commitment, and pay your soccer registration fees.

4) Be prepared to show government id to verify the player's date of birth.

5) A signed but undated cheque may be required to secure volunteer commitments such as bingos, casinos, community events, ENZSA events.

6) Determine your community's valid payment methods. McLeod's valid payment methods are cash, credit and debit. Other communities may accept cheques.

Benefits of Community Soccer

Parents often ask "Why sign up for community soccer?"

The most obvious benefit of community soccer is exercise. The average season goes from May 1st to June 30th, with post season opportunities in July for older teams.

Players can expect one practice and two games per week, each approximately one hour in duration.

The community program focuses on friends playing with friends and having fun. When registering for the McLeod soccer program, players can request to play with a certain



friend. We try to honour the request as best as possible. There are occasions when friend or coach requests cannot be filled, as every team has a team player limit. Players can expect fair field time in regular season games. There are other leagues out

there that organize players by skill level and age with an emphasis on winning and unfortunately not all players get an opportunity to play or play with their friends.

Community soccer is very affordable. In addition to registration fees, players are responsible for their own footwear, shin pads, socks, and shorts. McLeod will provide jerseys that will be returned upon season end with the exception for U6 and U8 players who keep their jerseys. Parents will be required to purchase a community membership and sign up for one community service per child to a maximum of two per family. Other soccer programs will have more expensive registration fees, require you to purchase jerseys, and participate in multiple volunteer/fund raising activities.

McLeod soccer acknowledges our players have many interests, with soccer only being one. Our older players, for example, often have part time jobs to earn spending money. McLeod soccer does not penalize players for missing the odd practice or game and we're grateful for them making as many soccer events as possible. Other soccer leagues have been known to bench players for missing practices or games.

EMSA Online Registration and Payment for McLeod Soccer

When registering for soccer using the EMSA Soccer Portal, do not select the Credit Card (Online Payment) option. Select the payment option of Other and pay at McLeod hall during a community registration session. If you do select the Credit Card (Online Payment) option, a \$10 surcharge will be added to your registration fee.

The EMSA Soccer Portal contains a feature allowing registrants the ability to pay their soccer registration fee online. Proceeds from the online payment are directed back to the player's home community, not the community the player ultimately plays in. This becomes problematic when registration fees are paid online and players register directly with communities other than their home communities. Soccer Directors must then contact the player's home community and request the registration fee be transferred. Occasionally, home community Soccer Directors become frustrated when registrants do not follow proper protocol, registering with the home community, signing up for a home community volunteer commitment and then requesting a transfer. Additionally, registration fees vary by community. This leads to confusion regarding registration fee discrepancies when attending the desired playing community's registration session.

Fees paid online via the EMSA Soccer Portal are subject to a credit card transaction fee, much like retailers pay. ENZA subtracts the credit card fees from the registration fees remits the remaining amount to community leagues. When paying registration fees at McLeod community league by credit or debit card, the community will absorb the transaction fees and they are not charged back to the sports programs.

For the outdoor season, McLeod will add a \$10 surcharge to registration fees when the EMSA Soccer Portal payment option of Credit Card (Online Payment) is selected to accommodate credit card fees and administrative overhead. This surcharge will not be added to registration fees when paying by credit or debit card at McLeod hall.

Here are the definitions for the EMSA Soccer Portal payment methods.

Credit Card (Online Payment) – Credit card information will be collected and credit card will be immediately charge the fees posted on the EMSA Soccer Portal. ENZSA will forward the soccer registration fee less the credit card transaction fee to the home community.

Cheque – Player registration fees will be paid by cheque at a community league payment session.

Cash – Player registration fees will be paid in cash at a community league payment session. Funding Plan Request – This is an informational checkbox indicating a subsidy request will be made at a community league payment session. The EMSA Soccer Portal does not contain functionality to complete or submit a subsidy application.

Other – This indicates a payment method other than those listed above will be used to pay player registration fees at a community payment session.

To summarize, McLeod community members selecting the Credit Card (Online Payment) option will incur a \$10 surcharge as payment is made directly to ENZSA. All other payment options will result in payment at a McLeod community league payment session. Valid payment methods for McLeod community league are cash, credit, or debit. Those paying by credit or debit at a McLeod hall will not incur a \$10 surcharge.

Welcome 2017. It's been a cold start to the new year. I thought I would start off with a message regarding warming up your vehicles.

Thank you to those that are brushing the snow off your vehicles and ensuring your license plates are not covered and your windows and mirrors are clear.

There have been multiple thefts of running motor vehicles across the province including here in Edmonton.

If you leave your vehicle unlocked and running there is a good chance it might not be there when you are ready to go. It takes mere seconds to for a thief to jump in and drive off with your vehicle.

I recommend you have a car starter installed. If that isn't an option, then cut a spare key and ensure the doors are locked. In addition, you can purchase and place a steering wheel club lock on the steering wheel.

Ensure any valuables are not left in plain site (loose change, cell phones, iPods, iPads, Cd's, garage door openers).

I wanted to talk about license plate covers. License plate covers clear, tinted, or reflective are illegal under the Traffic Safety Act.

License plates must be secured, visible and un-obscured at all times. License plate covers can be removed and seized as evidence. Fines can be from \$155 to \$465 dollars.

This can also apply to those that have their Chevrolet/GM spare tire access cover open blocking the last digit of the license plate, hitch balls, hitch bike carriers and mud or snow.

Friendly reminder – the government does not send out registration or drivers' license renewal reminders anymore.

Daily walk around of your vehicle will help you to remember when to renew your license plates.

I suggest you view your driver's license and insurance card monthly to ensure they are up to date and on your person when operating a motor vehicle.

When you register or renew your registration ensure you put the month and sticker on your license plate. Displaying an expired license plate could get you a Violation Ticket for \$310.00 dollars.
