Registration Process

- 1. Register online in the EMSA Soccer Portal. If you have played in the last 3 years, you will have an account. New players must create an account (https://emsasoccerportal.
- 2. Print 2 copies of the player summary confirmation and bring them to registration. This printed copy will give you the date and address of the registration as well as a list of all the items to bring to complete the registration. If you can't print the player summary, then ensure the player summary confirmation email is in your inbox on your mobile device.
- 3. Attend the Kilkenny registration session at 14910 - 72 Street to purchase a community membership (A New Membership is required for the Indoor Soccer Season 2018-2019), sign up for a volunteer commitment (or pay

out the commitment fee), and pay your registration fees.

- 4. Please bring government ID to verify the player's date of birth.
- 5. Proof of address is required a piece of ID or mail with your Kilkenny address on it.
- 6. A signed but undated cheque is required to secure each volunteer service such as casinos, community events, and ENZSA.
- 7. Please complete the on-line registration as soon as possible so we can get a general idea of the number of players we have. If you have any problems registering on the soccer portal, there is an instructional video.
- 8. If you are wanting to transfer to another community, I advise you to register as early as possible as we have had some communities reject transfers if their programs are full.
- 9. Deposits for uniforms will be taken when the uniforms are handed out by the coaches and not at registration. The uniform deposit will be \$75.00.

Just a reminder that you are allowed to play in any community you want but you must first register on-line via your community and attend your community's registration session before you can be transferred to the community of your choice.

Play soccer for health, wellness — and fun

Soccer has been dubbed "the world's sport" for a reason. A recent survey by FIFA, soccer's international governing body, found it's a pastime shared by 265 million players around the globe. That's about four per cent of the world's population.

This summer many of them will watch the FIFA (Fédération Internationale de Football Association) World Cup in Russia. And they'll take to streets, parking lots, empty spaces, backyards and beaches to play the game.

One of the great things about soccer is you don't need to break the bank to play it. "Soccer is inexpensive if you want it to be. It could be as simple as two kids in a park with a ball, having fun, or better still, playing with their

parents," says John Clubb, the Alberta Soccer Association's manager of Grassroots Devel-

For children under six, it's about gaining the fundamentals of physical literacy: running and kicking. From seven to nine, it's about ball mastery: foot dribbling the ball while running and weaving through opponents. Most of all, it's about fun!

Children focus on developing their own skills and that gives them a chance to explore parts of the game. "So let them be and encourage them to have fun with the ball," Clubb says. "At 10 to 12 years old, they are old enough to be introduced to team play and passing the ball."

Whatever your or your children's age and ability, playing some form of soccer can add to physical, social and emotional health and

Players can reduce the risk of injury by warming up before playing and by wearing protective equipment, such as shin guards.

Christina Loitz, a health promotion facilitator with Alberta Health Services, says soccer helps brain function, coordination, balance, gross motor skills and stress reduction.

McLeod President's Message

Did you know that the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL) has been the united voice of community leagues in Edmonton for almost 100 years? Here is an excerpt from https://efcl.org/about-us/history/:

"During the early 1900s, several cities across the U.S. had associations known as City Clubs. These predominately male social clubs met over lunch to discuss local issues and community activities. George M. Hall, a US immigrant and Edmonton's industrial commissioner, saw the basic concept of these clubs as a solution to solving many of the problems that plagued new neighbourhoods in terms of lack of community infrastructure and organization. He introduced it to his own new neighbourhood - Jasper Place, which at the time, was located just outside of Edmonton. Based on this ideal, in 1917, Hall would help integrate two groups - Jasper Place Rate Payers and the local horticultural society - to form Edmonton's first community league. We know it today as Crestwood Community League. He would become its first president.

The guidelines of the league were to ensure it was all-inclusive, regardless of class or ethnicity, open to both men and women (well ahead of its time) and did not have any affiliation with any political party or religious order. Its mandate would be on providing civic advocacy on behalf of its community, plus develop social and recreational opportunities and infrastructure. These guidelines and the mandate have never changed and are adopted by each new community league.

EFCL was officially founded on January 24, 1921 with the agreement of the nine community leagues in place at that time. Today, there are 157 community leagues across Edmonton who put in an incredible number of volunteer hours in order to run free or



low-cost sports, programs and events for residents. This type of civic engagement is remarkable and in real costs, would amount to millions of dollars. The EFCL also works in partnership with the City on issues such as infill, parks, open spaces, and development so that residents' voices are heard via their community leagues (who live in and care about their neighborhoods!).

In recent years, I have concluded that the City has moved away from engaging with community leagues on many significant matters. This is not only alarming but detrimental to the fundamental importance of the community league movement. In a time where the internet and social media reign, community leagues bring neighbors closer together with face-to-face interactions. As the City commences consideration of their budget and priority projects, I ask that you contact your Councillor and stress to them that they need to keep the EFCL and community leagues in the forefront when they make their decisions.

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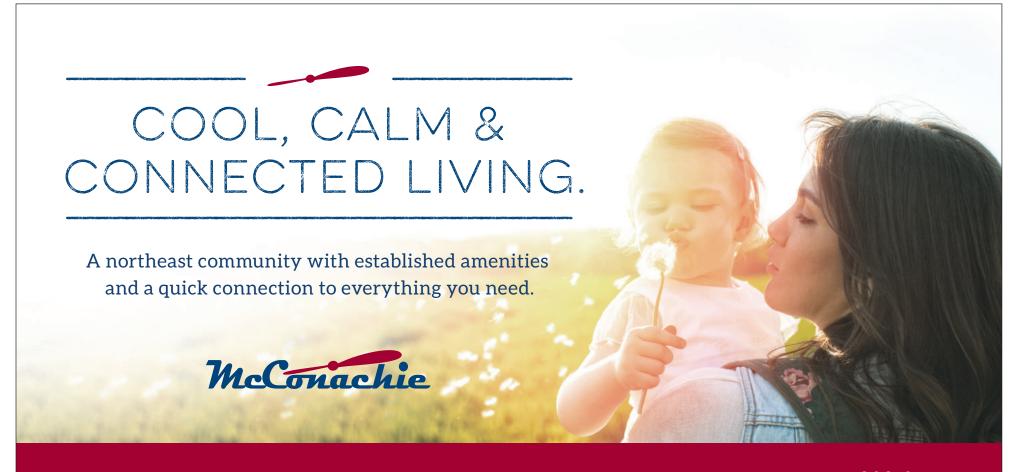

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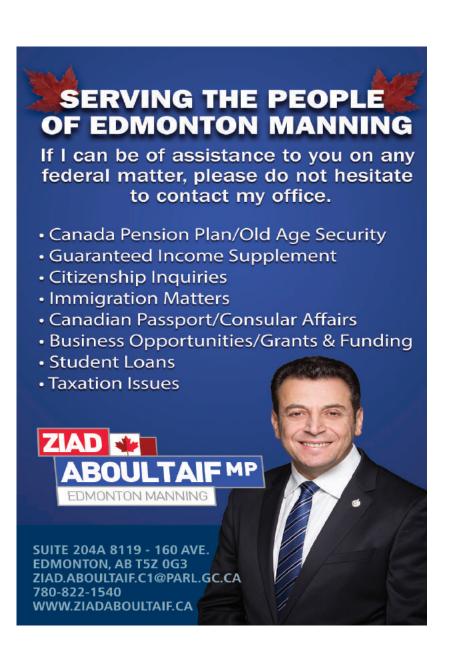

McLeod Community Safety Director

Young Drivers/Distracted Drivers is August's focus under the Alberta Traffic Safety Calender. Young drivers are still learning the rules of the road and making rookie mistakes behind the wheel. Smartphones and young passengers can be equally distracting to young drivers. When teenagers are driving in the car with their friends, they still want to be included in the passenger conversations and social media excitement. Parents and/or Guardians – have the conversation with our young drivers about these added distractions. Get them to drive you around, praise them for what they are doing well and explain how they can get even better. Just because they have passed a road test does not mean you can't assist them in being even better drivers.

For the rest of us who are not young drivers, we are not perfect either. Please stay off your phone, and that includes at red lights. You can still be issued a Violation Ticket even though you are stopped. Secondly do not drive with your pet in your lap. This interferes with your ability to operate a motor vehicle and you can be issued a violation ticket under the Traffic Safety Act.

Seat belts

Still seeing a lot of people, including drivers and passengers, not wearing their seat belt or not wearing them properly. Please buckle up. It is for your safety. Having the shoulder strap of your seat belt under your arm is not wearing it properly and you can receive a violation ticket for that. Fines for not wearing your seat belt or improperly wearing your seat belt is \$155.00 under the Alberta Vehicle Equipment Regulations.

Stop Signs

When you approach a stop sign, you must stop before the line on the roadway, before a painted cross walk, or three meters before the intersecting roadway if no crosswalk or



lines are painted on the roadway. Stopping after the line, crosswalk, or closer than three meters from an intersecting roadway will net you with a violation ticket. There is a rumour out there you have to stop for three seconds. That is false. However, your vehicle's motion has to cease. A lot of drivers perform what's called a rolling stop where they slow down, look both ways and then proceed. This is not a stop and you will get a violation ticket for \$388.00 dollars plus 3 demerit points under the Alberta Use Of Highway Rules and The Road Regulation.

Neighbourhoods

Whether you live in McLeod or any other community please do not speed in residential neighbourhoods. No one likes watching a vehicle zoom by on their street while they are out working or enjoying time in their yards with the beautiful weather we have been having. Slow down and be sure to watch for any children that might be out and about.

Lastly please remember - you must reduce speed to 60 km/h or the posted speed, whichever is lower, when passing emergency vehicles or tow trucks that are stopped with their lights flashing. This law applies to the lane(s) immediately next to the stopped vehicles. The fine for speeding in these areas is doubled. Please help ensure your first responders and tow truck operators go home at the end of their shift!!!

What is the Proper Registration Process for McLeod

There is a misconception that parents must attend the registration session of the community they'd like their child to play in if it's a community other than their home community. The EMSA Soccer Portal has been designed to capture a requested community to play in along with friend or coach request. The portal will automatically place an entry in a transfer queue for both the home and requested communities to approve. The home community approves the transfer out, followed by the requested community approving the transfer in. It is recommended parents attend a community league's first registration session to provide the best opportunity to be placed on their desired team.

Below are the general guidelines for registering for community soccer.

Register online in the EMSA Soccer Portal.

Print two copies of the player summary confirmation. If you can't print the player summary, then ensure the player summer confirmation email is in your inbox on your mobile device.

Attend your home community's registra-

tion session to purchase a community membership (if necessary), sign up for a volunteer commitment, and pay your soccer registration fees

Be prepared to show government id to verify the player's date of birth.

A signed but undated cheque may be required to secure volunteer commitments such as bingos, casinos, community events, ENZSA events.

Determine your community's valid payment methods. McLeod's valid payment methods are cash, credit and debit. Other communities may accept cheques.

If you are looking to transfer to another community to play for the upcoming season, it is highly recommended you attend your community's first registration session to complete your registration and ensure the Soccer Director is aware of your intentions. This will provide a higher degree of certainty your transfer will be successful.

All passes expire on December 31, 2019.

Increase to Deposit Amount and Bingo Hours

Due to an increase in the number of people who "no-show" at their community service event, the McLeod Board has approved an increase to the cheque deposit amount to \$200 per child registered in a sport/program (maximum of \$400 per 2+children). That means that if you choose to purchase WEM passes instead, you will receive 14 passes for \$200. The buy-out option is still available but will also increase to \$200 per child.

McLeod Residents Play a Key Role in Monitoring Construction Sites



While the City of Edmonton tries to proactively inspect infill construction sites for compliance to approved development permits and other regulations, not all developments are visited. If you are noticing an issue with the infill development next door to you or throughout the community, you have the ability to flag this for inspection.

Ideally your first step would be to contact the prime contractor or property owner listed on the development sign situated on the construction site. Expressing your concerns to those in charge of the construction may be all that is needed. If issues persist, then contact the City.

Below are some tips.

Landscaping Requirements

In the Edmonton Zoning Bylaw (section 55), it indicates that "Landscaping shall be provided on a

Site within 18 months of the occupancy of a development or commence of a Use." In addition, "Trees and shrubs shall be maintained on a Site for a minimum of 42 months after the occupancy of a development or commence of a Use."

Should you notice that landscaping has not been provided and fulfilled as per the bylaw, phone 311, or better yet, email 311@ edmonton.ca to file a complaint. 311 will then create a ticket for a Development Permit Inspection Team to investigate further, and to possibly schedule an inspection should they have reason to believe that construction has not proceeded in accordance to their approved Development Permit. Please note that landscaping is often not undertaken until ap-

proved lot grading is completed.

Damage to public infrastructure (public trees, boulevards, alleyways)

If you notice that boulevard trees within 5m of a construction site are not fenced, or vehicles are crossing boulevards without plywood or mats being placed on the boulevard, contact 311. Your actions could prevent serious damage to Edmonton's treed boulevards.

If you note damage to public infrastructure contact 311 to file a complaint. Ask 311 to forward your complaint to "City Infrastructure, Parks and Roads." (These are key words to include with your complaint.)

It would be helpful to take date stamped photos of public infrastructure (and private property) before construction begins. Once construction begins, if you note damages being done, keep your distance and take photos of offending vehicles and equipment. Little can be done without proof of who did the damages. It would be extremely helpful to include your photos when reporting a damage.

Additional Problems to Report to 311 Sidewalk obstructions

Foundations too close to the property line or buildings too high (ask for an inspection)
Washing out of cement trucks onto streets
Garbage

Construction before 7 am or after 9 pm on weekdays, and before 9 am on Sundays

Unsafe conditions such as unfenced excavation site or slumping soil at excavation.
