### **Ask Charles - Real Estate Q&A**

The seller's real estate agent lied about the house I put an offer on. Will filing a complaint with the Real Estate Council of Alberta, get me out of my purchase?

Filing a complaint with the Real Estate Council of Alberta (RECA) won't help you get out of your purchase, but you are encouraged to file a complaint against the seller's agent if you believe they lied to you.

RECA's complaint-handling process is disciplinary in nature. RECA can issue discipline against industry professionals only after reviewing the complaint, collecting evidence,

conducting interviews, and holding a hearing. And only if the industry professional is found to have breached the legislation or industry standards.

Penalties issued against industry members can be significant; up to \$25,000 per breach. However, RECA's disciplinary process can't get your money back, award you any damages, or will it enable you to get out of your purchase.

The offer to purchase that you submitted, and the seller accepted, is a contract that created legal and binding obligations. RECA does

not have the authority to intervene with these legal contracts.

In the event that the lie was significant enough that you believe you will be financially or otherwise disadvantaged by continuing with the purchase, you should talk to a lawyer as soon as possible. A lawyer can advise you on potential legal action you can take after your purchase closes.

Consumers do not automatically receive compensation from this Fund as a result of filing a complaint. Rather, there is an application process which, in some cases, requires a consumer to file a lawsuit against the industry professional in question. ### Here's what you need to know about Spring **Waste Collection!**

### From Councillor Karen Principe

Spring Waste Collection has started the first week of April. It will run until the first week of November and during this time vour green food scraps cart will be collected weekly.

Want to get your yard ready for Spring? Here's a few things you can do in preparation for the snow melting:

Get ready for your compost pile to thaw out. Make sure vou start mixing that pile again and balancing Greens, Browns, Water, and Air as it thaws.

If you have a ton of leaves, rake just a little bit. The less you rake the better, but if your leaves cover around 90% of your lawn, then rake a little bit to move them

Get to Mulching! Chop up all those branches and leaves on vour yard into little bits, and lay them over a liner near your trees, garden beds, or edges of your landscape. Don't forget that you can pick up free mulch in the form of wood chips from the Kennedale Eco Station!

Drop off excess grass, leaves, and branches for FREE vearround by taking these items to an Eco Station. (Note: Materials should be loose or in paper bags. Visit edmonton.ca/ecostations for more information.)

Don't forget you can use your green food scraps cart to put small amounts of grass clip-



pings, leaves, and other yard trimmings in the food scraps cart. Just ensure the cart lid closes completely.

Also Seasonal Yard Waste Collection starts in April for grass clippings, leaves, and other yard trimmings. This will run on Mondays from April 24 until June 19! Check out your collection days below:

**Tuesday Collection:** April 24, May 29 **Wednesday Collection:** May 1, June 5 **Thursday Collection:** 

May 8, June 12


**Friday Collection:** May 15, June 19

Put them in a double-ply paper bag or any see-through plastic bag and set them out at your curb on collection day. Seasonal collection occurs twice in the spring and twice in the fall. Find your collection dates on edmonton.ca/waste

### Do you know the signs of a stroke?



A stroke occurs when a blood vessel in the brain is blocked or bursts. Without blood and the oxygen it carries, part of the brain starts to die. The part of the body controlled by the damaged area of the brain can't work properly.

Brain damage can begin within minutes. That's why it's important to know the symptoms of stroke and to act fast. Quick treatment can help limit damage to the brain and increase the chance of a full recovery.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms of a stroke happen quickly. A stroke may cause:

- Sudden numbness, tingling, weakness, or loss of movement in your face, arm, or leg, especially on only one side of your body.
  - Sudden vision changes.
  - Sudden trouble speaking.
- · Sudden confusion or trouble understanding simple statements.
- · Sudden problems with walking or balance.
- · A sudden, severe headache that is different from past headaches.

If you have any of these symptoms, even if they go away quickly, call 911 or other emergency services immediately.

Remember: FAST.

The acronym "FAST" is a simple way to remember the main symptoms of a stroke. Recognizing these symptoms helps you know when to call for medical help. FAST stands for:

- · Face: Is it drooping
- Arms: Can you raise both?
- Speech: Is it slurred or jumbled?
- Time: To call 911 right away.

It's important to act fast and to call for medical help if you have stroke symptoms. Quick treatment may save your life, and it may reduce the damage in your brain so that you have fewer problems after the stroke.

### **Bicycle Helmet** Safety



Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. It is the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

### **Getting informed**

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent significant injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

### **Getting started**

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride need to wear helmets;
- Parents can lead by example always wear a helmet when cycling.

### Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To assess the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened;
- Adjust the chin straps to form a "Y" below and slightly forward from the ears;
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it fastened;
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort, and safety.
