Alberta Traffic Safety Calendar Focus for March is Seat belts. Seat belts must be worn and worn properly. Shoulder straps cannot be put under the arm. Failure to do so can result in a fine of \$162.00. If you have a Dr. Letter which says due to health issues you cannot wear a seat belt, the Letter must be with you and it is only good for one year from the date the letter was issued.

Car Seats are required to be installed properly. Be sure to read you vehicle manual and your car seat manual on proper Car Seat placement and proper installation. If you are still unsure on the Car Seat installation or usage try and locate a Child Passenger Safety Technician. Free clinics are usually put on few times a year. Go online to www.cpsac.org or www. stjohn.ab.ca

Did you know?

Did you know that unless a Traffic signal or sign indicates otherwise that you must come to a complete stop at a red light and turn. Fine Amount is \$405.00 Plus 3 Demerit Points.

Did you know that if you change your name, physical address or postal address you have up to 14 days to attend registries and update. Ensure you give registries your current cell phone number. This will assist officers if they need to contact you regarding snow removal, parking or traffic complaint. Fine Amount is \$162.00. This could help you avoid a ticket or tow.

Did you know that if your Licence Plate is obscured by snow, ice, mud, dirt or any type of license plate cover you can receive a Violation Ticket with the Fine amount of \$162.00. Same goes for hitch balls or Chevrolet/G.M.C Spare tire access covers.

Did you know that you cannot have any Tint on your front door windows or windshield. This includes Tinted Brows on your windshield. Fines can range from \$81.00 to \$162.00 and can include an order to remove. Failure to comply with order can result in a fine of \$243.00

Did you know that you cannot exceed the Maximum Speed Limit for any reason. That includes passing other vehicles, going down

hills, driving with what you believe is the flow of traffic.

Did you know that you are responsible that your Driver's License is Valid, and the registration and or insurance in the vehicle is valid and on hand if you are stopped by an officer. This includes vehicles that are not yours. Insurance and Registration only can be viewed electronically.

Did you know that if your Driver's License is Suspended and after the Suspension is over that you cannot drive a motor vehicle until your license has been reinstated by Alberta Transportation. Failure to do so can result in your vehicle being seized for 30-60 Days and a Court Appearance being required which may result in a substantial fine.

Did you know that a GDL Driver's Licence in Alberta only allows you to have up to 8 Demerits before it's Suspended.

Did you know that a Convicted Traffic Offence demerits stay on your license for 2 years. Home Safety

Make sure all staircases have solid handrails, securely affixed flooring, adequate lighting and safety gates if there are small children in the home.

Don't put any tripping hazard near the stairs. Replace any broken electrical cords and do not ply in more than two plugs per outlet.

If you use a plug in space heater at home or at the office inspect daily plug, cord and unit.


Check your hot water tank temperature setting and ensure the hot water is not turned up too high to avoid burns.

Never mix bleach, ammonia, or other cleaning liquids together when you are cleaning. When mixed, cleaning liquids can create deadly gases.

Always supervise babies and young children when bathing. If the phone rings at bath time, then leave it. It is not as important as your child's safety.

Ensure that, when you place knives and forks in the dishwasher, blades and prongs are facing downwards to avoid cuts.

Keep trash bags away from children to avoid suffocation hazard.

Update on the Snow and Ice Control (SNIC) program

This winter we have experienced several periods of warm weather, and the realities of climate change are top of mind when it comes to adapting the SNIC program.

This 2022-23 winter season:

- Crews held off residential blading when weather warmed so that heavy equipment would not create deeper ruts in a slushy 5 cm snowpack. School zone windrow pickup was rescheduled from February/March to January 15-23 to proactively address safety concerns from the unseasonably warm temperatures.

- Smaller equipment was used to support the grooming of the residential streets to mitigate the impact of large windrows and snowpack blocking access points and catch basins.

- Pathways previously narrowed due to snow build-up were widened to improve pedestrian mobility and lessen the effects of freeze/thaw cycles.

- Cul-de-sacs were cleared in advance of an earlier spring melt to get ahead of flooding concerns.

As winter weather continues to evolve, Administration is working on new ways to respond to the realities of climate change by:

I improving the accuracy of weather prediction resources and how to respond to smaller, more frequent weather events versus historically larger weather events.

I reviewing the way road and active pathway inventories are prioritized to ensure priorities align with public utilization.

l upgrading snow storage sites to respond to faster snow storage melt.


Council approved a one-time, \$4.7 million increase in June of 2022 to enhance and improve the current 'R1/AP1' level of service that would start with the upcoming winter season. In the fall of 2022, the SNIC team initiated the newly enhanced R1/AP1 level of service, which included hiring additional seasonal staff. During the budget debates in early December, Council reviewed and considered a service package presented by the SNIC team. This package included many proposed enhancements such as snow removal on curb cuts and driveways, additional windrow removal from school zones, and clearing new types of infrastructure such as shared streets, walking alleys, and internal park pathways. In December 2022, Council made a final decision on the proposed service package and approved 20% of the requested budget increase over the 2023-2026 budget cycle. Administration retained the seasonal staff hired in 2022 but will now work on maintaining the service levels that were initiated at the start of this winter with the funds approved less than expected.

This graph shows the base funding for the SNIC program. While weather plays a factor in actual costs incurred, there has not been a significant funding increase to the base budget, especially in relation to the increase in mobility network inventory.

Administration will present an evaluation of the 2022-23 SNIC program to Council in June 2023, which will include performance metrics, feedback from Council and the public, insights from the Community Sandbox Program Review, and recommendations for SNIC service delivery for the 2023-24 winter season. Excessive vehicle noise bylaw info


Edmonton's City Council amended Traffic Bylaw 5590 to create a new offence for excessive vehicle noise. Previously, only excessive motorcycle noise was included.


Currently, City of Edmonton Peace Officers, in collaboration with the Edmonton Police Service, enforce excessive passenger vehicle noise offences using the provincial Traffic Safety Act and its Regulations, and excessive motorcycle noise through the Community Standards Bylaw.

The new offence and fine amount is intended to work as an additional deterrent to excessive vehicle noise when offences in Alberta's Traffic Safety Act have been exhausted and are not serving as a meaningful deterrent and in cases where the seriousness of the offence merits its use. Enforcement officers will exercise discretion when applying this new offence recognizing each situation can be unique and doesn't always warrant a ticket.

Under this new section, excessive vehicle noise carries a fine of \$1,000 and is doubled for a sub-sequent offence.

The new offence came into effect Feb 24.
