

Seniors

Follow-up to the Seniors Housing event held on June 1st: A survey was available at the event and although only a small number of surveys were completed, there were some interesting results: There was interest in a variety of housing options, from low rise to high rise. Many people were interested in renting while some would consider owning, and a few were interested in cooperative housing options. The majority of respondents wanted to be close to shopping and to transit. Most were interested in a seniors/adults only building rather than multigenerational housing. Many wanted to have shared/group spaces and activities for residents in the building. Several people commented that much of the seniors housing in the area is subsidized housing and that they did not meet the eligibility requirements for these facilities. We heard of a housing project underway in south Edmonton that would be open to people from a wider range of incomes, and there was a lot of interest in this type of housing model.

In terms of availability of seniors housing in this part of Edmonton, what we heard from the experts is that the main issue is availability of land. It takes a large parcel of land to put in a seniors housing project, preferably land that is already zoned for this type of project, or that would be relatively easy to re-purpose. Developers will often partner with other organizations such as not for profits to develop seniors housing. School lands in other parts of Edmonton have been re-purposed for housing. Other lands such church properties sometimes become available for affordable housing projects. So keep your eyes and ears open and talk to your neighbours and friends. Developers seem to be interested in projects in the area should a suitable site become available.

Dementia advice available provincially through Health Link

Currently, about 40,000 Albertans are living with dementia, a syndrome that affects memory, thinking, orientation, judgment and ability to carry out daily activities.

This number is expected to more than double in Alberta as the baby boom generation moves into older age. By 2038, it is estimated that about one in 10 Albertans over the age of 65, and nearly half over age 90, will be living with dementia.

Alberta Health Services provides province-wide, specialized dementia advice through Health Link to help support individuals and caregivers living with dementia, including people with Alzheimer's disease.

By dialing 811 – any time, any day – callers will reach Health Link staff who can assess their needs and provide immediate advice for their health concerns. When needed, callers can also be referred to a specialized dementia nurse for additional support.

Specialized dementia nurses can provide a more in-depth assessment to to gain an understanding of each individual situation and provide personalized support and advice, as well as connecting callers to available community services and supports.



Neighbourhood renewal comes to Strathearn

Strathearn is about to undergo a makeover the likes of which it has never seen before.

Within a few years, there will be an LRT line running through our community, the Strathearn Heights apartment complex will have been transformed, bringing with it higher density and accompanying retail outlets, and our aging streets and sidewalks will have been replaced with new curbs, gutters and asphalt.

The sidewalk and street repairs north of 95 Avenue will be done in 2017, while those south of 95 Avenue will be done in 2018.

As part of the Neighbourhood Renewal program, streetlights will be replaced with LED lights and new lampposts.

Based on a community survey conducted in March of 2016, there was overwhelming support (74%) for pursuing an upgraded decorative pole option.

As a result, the community league has made an Expression of Interest to the city to upgrade from the standardized galvanized pole to a black, fluted pole with a Newport decorative arm and decorative street blades for signage.

The cost to property owners will be approximately \$3 per month over the next 15 years, or there is an option for a one-time payment. This levy will begin the year following sidewalk construction.

The next step in the process involves you.

The City of Edmonton will be sending information packages to all property owners by Sept. 1. Please support this initiative and send back a signed form to show your support for this upgrade.

We will need a majority of property owners to sign the petition in order for this upgrade to proceed!

Poison Prevention

The Poison & Drug Information Service (PADIS) offers a free, confidential poison line for Albertans, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The service offers expert advice about poisons and toxins, medications, chemicals, recreational drugs and plants. When calling the poison centre, callers speak with a specially-trained nurse or pharmacist who gives information and offers advice on how to best manage poisonings and exposures.

Medication and herbal advice is also available through PADIS offering up-to-date information for the safe use of over-the-counter products, prescriptions, medications and herbals. This includes potential interactions between medications and/or herbals and safe medication options for pregnant and breast-feeding women.

PADIS plays a key role in helping Albertans safely manage poison exposures and can offer advice on the most appropriate level of health care service should it be needed.

PADIS also operates a Drug Information Line for Health Care Professionals. This free service for health professionals provides drug information for clinical situations, with the support of an on-call Medical Toxicologist.

Children in Hot Cars

Never leave your children unattended in the heat

It's an act of convenience that can kill. Every summer, EMS and other first response agencies respond to calls, across the province, where children have been left inside vehicles while their parent, or caregiver, "quickly ran inside".

According to experts, there is no safe amount of time to leave a child unattended in a vehicle in the heat. One study found that in 35°C weather it took just twenty minutes for the interior temperature of a car to rise to

Unlike adults, children's bodies aren't adapted to cool them rapidly. As a result, they are more susceptible to heat-related illness and injuries, even death.

It takes only minutes for tragedy to strike but just seconds to prevent it.

- Never leave a child alone in a vehicle, even for just a
- Always check the interior of the vehicle before you lock it to ensure you haven't left your child behind.
- Lock your vehicle when it's not in use so children can't get in without you knowing.
- If you see a child left unattended in a vehicle, call 911 immediately and, if possible, get the child out as quickly as you can.

It may seem more convenient to not have to fuss with a car seat or seat belt for a quick stop but a hot car is no place for a child. Save a life, not time.

When Gloria Opgenorth told her husband, Joe, that their church congregation at Our Lady of Assumption Parish wanted a communal garden, he knew it would be a lot of work.

Not that he minded. Joe has had a hand in most of the necessary parish infrastructure projects since he first joined the church on March 1, 1955.

"Joe and love gardening," Gloria says. Having



three large garden plots and fruit trees on their own property in Bonnie Doon, it was a natural fit when the idea of a communal garden presented itself.

A fortuitous run-in with a landscape gardener who was travelling between jobs significantly reduced the cost of preparing the ground at the corner of 95 Street and 90 Avenue in front of the church rectory that first year of the garden.

Even still, Joe had to till a couple more times before they planted.

This year Gloria took a crack with the rototiller. "It's okay if you're going in a straight line but when you are taking a turn, I mean, those are big, heavy machines," chuckles Gloria.

Joe and Gloria are just regular parishioners willing to do what needs to be done and the garden reflects that attitude.

Thirteen families from the congregation signed up for a portion of the plot last year.

When someone moved away or lost interest, someone else was always around to continue the work and reap the harvest.

Gloria and others make themselves available to help newbies

with planting and advice. There are tools available at the church and member gardeners have access to their plot any time.

Joe keeps a close eye on the

programmable watering system, having to adjust for all the rain this year, and Gloria says they were oversubscribed with participants for this season.

The Assumption Parish garden enlivens an important corner in Strathearn.

Gloria has had many impromptu conversations with passersby and recognizes that the garden has become a significant thread in the neighbourhood fabric.

"It's wonderful to watch things grow," enthuses Gloria.

So if you're leaning over the fence of Assumption Parish, be sure to thank whoever you come across. Strathearn residents are lucky to have hard working neighbours like Joe, Gloria and the parishioners of Assumption Parish beautifying the neighbourhood.
