

Avonmore Community League – Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of Avonmore Community League will be held on May 10, 7:00 p.m. at the Community Hall. The purpose of the meeting is to: report on the activities of the League for 2021-22, present a financial report for the past year and budget for the coming year, elect new board members and vote on a special resolution to amend the

league by-laws. There will also be a presentation of the results of the Avonmore Vision Project. All community members are invited to attend. Must be a member of Avonmore Community League to vote or take a position on the board. Agenda, reports and revised by-laws will be posted and sent to members in advance of the meeting.

What is a Community League?

A community league is a volunteer, not-forprofit organization formed to meet the unique needs and interests of residents within a defined geographic area of the City of Edmonton The role of Community League is to:

- Speak on behalf of their Community League members, and
- Report on behalf of all residents within the Community League's specified geographical area
- Bring neighbours together
- Provide recreation and social programs
- Develop amenities
- Represent community interests to the gov-

ernment and other organizations.

A Community League is an autonomous body, registered under the Societies Act with the Corporate Registry of the Government of Alberta. Therefore, it must have a properly elected board of directors including committee chairpersons responsible for carrying out the business of the league. Each individual Community League has specific boundaries that will define its membership. Currently there are 161 Community Leagues in Edmonton. Leagues are grouped in 12 Edmonton Federation of Community League Districts. Each District appoints one director to EFCL.

You Can Make a Difference in the Avonmore Community

The ideal way to make a difference and affect change is to serve on the board of the Community League or volunteer to lead or support a program or activity. Every year many Avonmore residents dedicate their time and expertise to shape the future of the league and community as board members and volunteers. Board members provide the critical intellectual capital and strategic resources to power success and strengthen our community. Volunteers make it possible to offer programs, maintain facilities (e.g. rink and hall) and keep the community informed of happenings.

-Do you have specialized skills and expertise that could benefit the board of the community league and the community as a whole?

-Are you willing to be an enthusiastic advocate for the League and the community and encourage others to get involved?

Serving on a board is a wonderful way to support the community and a cause that you care about. It also can be a powerful way to build your own skills and expertise.

Individuals who serve on the board can develop and grow as leaders, cultivate new skill sets, and expand their network of peers, professionals, community leaders, and community thought leaders.

Active Avonmore - Avonmore Moves

In Avonmore, we are currently running a movement initiative, in support of mental Health going until at least the end of May 2022. We know there is a definite connection between mental health and exercise!

Since the beginning of June 2021, we've encouraged Avonmore residents to track their movement in kilometers. Some residents use a device that tracks their movement of steps, running, biking or others calculate 20 minutes of workouts which equals 1.6 kms. Community members record their movement and send their information to me so we record the numbers for the whole neighbourhood.

We have 16 people who regularly track their movement and send in their numbers. Between June 1, 2021 and March 20, 2022 Avonmore community members have moved and travelled a total of 58,099.14 kms. That is equivalent to movement from Vancouver to St John's return, Edmonton to Disneyland return, Edmonton to Disneyworld return, we went to the North Pole and were Santa's Elves!!! We travelled more than the circumference of the earth which is 40,075 Kms. We are currently travelling home from Panama City; Panama and we're thinking where we'll go next in 2022. Soon April will be here so we'll all be out moving more, join us in the fun!!!

We want you to join us in tracking our movement! To encourage your participation, we are enhancing our movement initiative to not only include kms from a device for walking running, biking but INCLUDE workouts: cross county/downhills skiing, snow shoeing, hockey, skating, figure skating, yoga, swimming, dance, cheerleading, soccer (games and practices), You tube workouts, Zoom exercises, etc. Anything you or your kids do that is active is eligible! Count 20 minutes of exercise is equivalent to 1.6 kms/4.8 for the hour!

We would like everyone who can log their workouts, steps or biking kms to join us! Please join us the rest of Avonmore is this fun way to improve our physical and mental health by doing these two things:





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
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What is glaucoma?

Glaucoma is the name for a group of eye diseases that damage the optic nerve. This nerve carries information from the eye to the brain. When the nerve is damaged, you can lose your vision. Glaucoma is one of the most common causes of legal blindness in the world.

What causes it?

The exact cause of glaucoma isn't known. Experts think that increased pressure in the eye (intraocular pressure) may cause the nerve damage in many cases. But some people who have glaucoma have normal eye pressure.

What are the symptoms?

In open-angle glaucoma, the only symptom you may notice is loss of vision. Symptoms of closed-angle glaucoma can be mild and may last only a short time, such as blurred vision.

How is it diagnosed?

If your doctor thinks you have glaucoma, you will need to see an eye specialist.

How is glaucoma treated?

Glaucoma can't be cured. But there are things you can do to stop more damage to the optic nerve. To help keep your vision

from getting worse, you'll probably need medicine. You may also need laser treatment or surgery.

What can you do to cope with glaucoma?

If you have vision loss, there are things you can do to help keep your quality of life.

- Let people know that you have glaucoma. Carry a wallet card or other identification that says that you have glaucoma.
- Find ways to make the best uses of your remaining vision.
- Use vision aids such as video enlargement systems and I

arge-print items.

- Place lighting so that it's aimed at what you want to see and aimed away from your eyes.
- Mark the areas around stairways and ramps with paint or tape.
- Your doctor can also refer you to counsellors who specialize in helping people adjust to living with low vision.
- Check with a doctor before you take any over-the-counter medicines.

Ask Charles

I saw on the news that fraudsters are being charged with unlicensed real estate trading. Why do you need a licence to buy or sell property?

First things first. You don't need a licence to buy or sell property; consumers are always free to buy or sell their own property. When you need a licence, though, is when you're helping someone else buy or sell property.

The individuals you've seen in the news are people who are not licensed as real estate professionals, who say they will help consumers buy and sell property, but instead, they are actually participating in various fraud schemes. That's why they're in the news.

Still, unlicensed trading in real estate remains a serious issue and not just because of the fraud that sometimes results. Under the Real Estate Act of Alberta, anyone trading in real estate, dealing in mortgages, performing real estate appraisals, or providing property management services requires a licence from the Real Estate Council of Alberta (RECA). It's the law.

Buying a home is one of the largest financial commitments most people will ever make. Why would you want to trust that transaction with someone who doesn't have education, experience, and a regulatory body behind them?

When you hire a licensed real estate professional, you can trust they've completed prelicensing education, their background has been reviewed, they carry errors and omissions insurance, they're required to complete ongoing education, and you can feel confident that a regulatory body will hold them accountable for their actions. All real estate licensees are required to carry errors and omissions insurance, and there's a Consumer Protection Fund available in the very rare event a consumer suffers a financial loss as a result of fraud, breach of trust, or a failure to disburse or account for money held in trust by an in-



dustry member.

Think about it, you don't want people driving on the road who don't have a driver's licence, right? If someone has a driver's licence, it means they passed a competency test, and there's an unwritten agreement that they'll follow the rules of the road. If they don't, they can be fined or even lose their licence. The same thing applies to licensed real estate professionals. If they violate the rules, RECA has the authority to discipline them, which can include licence suspension or cancellation.

When someone doesn't have a real estate licence, and represents a consumer in a real estate deal, the consumer has no assurances that the person has knowledge or training, and there's nowhere to go – other than Court – if something goes wrong.

Ask Charles

I want to learn what I can about the real estate industry in Alberta, but it's hard to keep track of all the organizations and their acronyms. The regulator, the provincial association, the local real estate board; what do they do, and who's looking out for me?

This is understandable. The real estate industry has so many players and acronyms that even some industry veterans get them confused at times.

It may make things simpler by thinking about the organizations in two main groups: the regulator and trade associations.

In Alberta, the Real Estate Council of Alberta (RECA) is the regulator of real estate professionals. RECA sets the industry practice standards and is responsible for enforcing them, and all real estate professionals must be licensed by RECA.

RECA's mandate is to protect consumers. In the unlikely circumstance that your real estate professional breaks the rules that are in place, RECA can investigate the situation and can issue discipline. That discipline can include licence suspension or cancellation, and fines of up to \$25,000 per offence. RECA also provides services to real estate professionals that enable them to provide competent, ethical service to consumers. Among other things, these services include a practice advisor, information bulletins, and ongoing education.

The other organizations within the real estate industry that you've probably encountered are trade associations. Membership in a real estate industry trade association is voluntary.

In Canada, the primary trade association for residential real estate professionals is the Canadian Real Estate Association (CREA). There are also provincial trade associations that operate under CREA, and there are local real estate Boards, which operate under the pro-

vincial associations as well as under CREA.

To make things easier, it may be helpful to think of all of these associations as the same organization, but at different levels (national, provincial, and local). When your real estate professional mentions their 'board,' they mean their local real estate board, which is the local level of the national and provincial associations. By being a member of their local board, they are also members of their provincial association and of CREA, the national association.

Broadly speaking, the real estate trade associations work on behalf of their members and their members' commercial interests. The trade associations own certain trademarks that only their members can use, such as the word REALTOR®, and at the local board level, they operate the local real estate board listing database. Trade associations typically have government relations or lobbying departments, they provide advocacy for their members, and while they have rules their members need to follow, their rules aren't found in legislation, and they're not industry-wide requirements or practice standards.

I hope this information helps, but if at any time you feel overwhelmed by acronyms or unsure about any aspect of the real estate industry, contact RECA or let your real estate professional know. Licensed real estate professionals are there to help you understand your transaction and the industry.

No, unfortunately, she can't. To work in another province, someone needs to be licensed in that province. Real estate has different licensing rules and criteria from province to province, and while there are a lot of similarities, individuals need a licence in a jurisdic-

tion before working there.

The fact is, if you're buying a property in B.C., or any other place outside of Alberta, don't you want someone looking out for your interests who is familiar with the market and the rules in the area in which you want to buy? While I'm sure your Alberta real estate professional is a consummate professional and knows the ins and outs of our industry, the fact is, she knows Alberta real estate and Alberta real estate rules.

You will be better represented by working with someone in the area in which you're buying, someone who is licensed by the provincial authority in that province (in the case of B.C., it's the Real Estate Council of British Columbia).

However, there are other things that your Alberta real estate professional can do to assist you. Many real estate professionals have net-

works of professionals in other provinces and your real estate professional may be able to make suggestions of someone to work with. Alternatively, if you have friends or family that live there, you can ask them for a recommendation and of course, you can do Internet searching on your own.

I also suggest that you do as much as you can to research the market in which you're looking for a property.

Real estate transactions are significant commitments, with a full slate of obligations and responsibilities. And, things can certainly be a bit trickier when you're buying in a location in which you don't primarily live.

The best advice I can give you is to do all you can to ensure you're represented by a licensed industry professional who is knowledgeable about the market in which you are about to trade.

Strathearn-based Business Profile

For this month's profile we spoke with the Magpie Collective, a collective of artists and creators based in the Strathearn neighbourhood!

The Magpie Collective is brand new! How did it come into being?

Magpie Collective was founded by local visual artist, Theodora Harasymiw. She moved into the Strathearn space in 2016 through connections at ACUA (Alberta Council for the Ukrainian Arts) and Juniper Caf. Theo used the space as her own studio for a number of years and then in 2018 decided to look for artists to occupy some of the other rooms with a vision of starting a Collective. She wanted to build a space that would support, nurture, and challenge other creators while growing a community of like spirited individuals. Carrie Carbol-Ritcey was invited to join in 2018 and it has since grown to include Shelley MacGregor, Sylvie Ellis, & Cathy McMillan.... as well as our shop dog and greeter, Penny-Lou.

Can you tell us a little bit about the individual artists who comprise the collective?

Theo Harasymiw- Painter and Mosaicist Broken bits of bone and china, gears, bobbins, wood and teeth....what are these? Theo's Inspirations. She mosaics, paints, and roller-

skates sometimes all at once. Some say size doesn't matter but for Theo, the bigger (the mosaic) the better. Now if only she could find her keys.

Carrie Carbol-Ritcey - Silversmith and Sculptor Copper, silver, bronze and enamel, these are Carrie's Muses. Obsessed with tool collecting, pretty gems and playing with fire, she is our resident metalsmith. We often hear banging, drilling, and the occasional F-bomb coming from her studio. That's when we wait with bated breath to see her newest creation.

Shelley MacGregor - Mixed Media

Shelley likes to recycle, repurpose, and reimagine using organic materials. Her ability to create art using sticks, moss, fungi, and rusty bits (Not Rusty's bits) is magical to witness. Her giggles of glee as she creates are part of the process. Although, when she walks in carrying half a truck frame, "But I love rust!", we have to draw the

She lives in a painted world of misty forests, whimsical daydreams and ethereal figures who whisper to us their secret messages of playful nonsense. When not in her studio, Cath can be found wandering through old book stores and second hand shops, searching for magic and long lost treasures.

What draws the Magpies to locating their home base in Strathearn?

Community! We love the neighbourhood and the trees, and can often be found walking our dogs along Strathearn drive. Our space has amazing natural light, a must for artists. The strip mall community is also important to us - it's a mix of everything and we all support each other.

What is the significance of those beloved birds in your group's name?

Magpies - people either love them or hate them. They are resilient, outspoken and attracted to shiny things, not unlike our collective members! Edmonton is home to the largest population of magpies in North America, so it seemed fitting to use the name. We have a magpie that hangs out with us on the balcony; her name is Cassandra.


By the sounds of it, there are a lot of interesting classes and workshops coming up, even including a ukulele circle and tarot readings! Can you describe a few of these offerings?
