Argyll Sidewalk Parking/Curb Access-Fines?

Argyll had many more improvements to our sidewalks five years ago when the streets, lighting, and sidewalks were upgraded. There are many new locations where a wheelchair "dip" to the curb has been installed. Residents may not be aware of a restriction regarding these curb access points. There is a fine for parking within 5 meters of a sidewalk dip or ramp. Most of the locations for these ramps are at corners and crosswalks where a limited distance is already familiar to us. But it was not clear

to some residents there was a restriction on how close a vehicle can be to these ramps. Clearly it is so people using the ramp have visibility for oncoming traffic.

For those who have one in front of their home, be sure to tell your visitors to keep 5 meters from them or you may find a ticket on their windshield. Homeowners with a dip on their boulevard are asked to shovel the ramp as well as your sidewalk (just as you are asked to mow the boulevard grass) as part of your normal activities for public safety.

Hall and Grounds Renewal Update

The Hall and Grounds Renewal Committee (HGRC) provided the September update at the Old Strath Mini Folk Fest. It has been a busy summer for the HGRC and it will be an even busier fall.

In July, we were invited to submit an application for the Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) provincial grant. We submitted our application at the end of August and await an answer from them in January 2025.

In the meantime, work has commenced on the outdoor grounds portion of the project. If you have been by the Hall lately, you have seen some major changes, with the rink being dismantled and the support posts being removed. Resurfacing of the asphalt on the tennis court was completed in mid-September.

The League will work to reassemble the rink in the new location in time for the 2024/25 rink season.





As Catholic Trustees, we are committed to ensuring that our schools continue to foster learning environments where students can grow spiritually, academically, and emotionally. Our dedicated administrators, teachers, and support staff work tirelessly to make this possible. Halloween Safety



Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of Halloween safety tips as October 31st approaches. Take time to review these simple tips and reminders to help ensure that your Halloween is a fun and safe night for everyone.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: all regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- You may choose to avoid houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Parents

- Be certain that an adult accompanies young trick-or-treaters. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-ortreat within and establish a time to return home.
- Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.

Costumes

- Choose bright colored costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing, or making costumes, look for materials and accessories labeled flame-resistant
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic makeup kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes should not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate footwear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.


