Mobile PALS Unit

The Mobile Spay/Neuter Unit is an extension of EHS' Prevent Another Litter Subsidized (PALS) spay /neuter program https://www.edmontonhumanesociety.com/whatwe-do/services/pals-spay-neuter/. This program provides spay/neuter, microchip, and vaccination services to low-income families within the City of Edmonton.

Applications are typically processed online prior to the clinic, but the unit will have an on-site attendant present to answer any questions about the program to interested community members.

For the application process, families generally need to indicate financial need within these parameters (currently on AISH or Individuals/ Families whose combined income is below Federal Low Income Cut Off (LICO) before tax). For more information look for the poster in this edition!

ETS summer service changes



School is (almost) out for summer! On June 30, various bus routes, including school special routes, will see service adjustments to reflect typical summer ridership patterns.

School Special Routes

On June 30, all public and Catholic school routes and trips end due to the conclusion of the 2023/2024 school year

Most school special routes will resume on August 29 and 30 based on the previous school year's schedule. Students are encouraged to use trip planning tools on those two days. School special service will be fully implemented on September 3 when fall service adjustments take effect.

Increasing Route Consistency

Route 8 and several other routes will see travel time adjustments to ensure a more consistent schedule.

Construction and Detours

Several construction projects will lead to transit detours over the summer. This includes construction in the CN Tower traffic loop, EPCOR work on 34 Street and construction on 57 Avenue in west Edmonton. More details are available here.

On Demand Transit

On June 30, additional On Demand Transit hub options will be added to the Hays Ridge/Graydon Hill/Glenridding Ravine/Keswick, Northwest Police Campus and Goodridge Corners areas.

In addition to Century Park and Leger, Heritage Valley Transit Centre will be another hub for riders in the areas of Hays Ridge, Keswick, Glenridding Ravine and Graydon Hill. These additions will help facilitate transfers to Route 727 and other high schools in September.



Joining Eaux Claires, Castle Downs Transit Centre will be a new hub for riders in the areas of Northwest Police Campus, Goodridge Corners, Albany, Rapperswill, Canossa, Elsinore and Chambery neighbourhoods. These additions will improve connections for riders in Northwest Edmonton to other conventional transit options.

Other service changes

Several bus bays will be reassigned at Belvedere, Castle Downs, Century Park, Eaux Claires, Northgate, Stadium and Westmount Transit Centres.

Busier routes will now be closer to the bus shelters and will better align service with rider demand.

Updated Transit Centre maps can be found at edmonton.ca/transitcentres.

Route 124 will change its routing from 153 Avenue and 97 Street to 155 Avenue and 100 Street through the in-

terior of the Beaumaris neighbourhood. This change will decrease walking distances, making the route more accessible for riders in Beaumaris.

Route 525 will also see a routing change due to traffic calming measures being installed on 97 Street. Existing stops for Zettley and Pioneer Place will be maintained while another stop will be added on 96 Street & 76 Avenue southbound.

Route 905 will transition from a 30-foot bus to a 40-foot bus to increase service capacity and better service rider needs.

Riders are encouraged to plan their trips early by using the trip planner on edmonton.ca/transit or Google Maps and selecting a date after June 30.

Roll your way downtown with the City's Summer Bike Valet

The City of Edmonton is putting the pedal to the metal this summer with a free bike valet downtown. Those looking to cycle to one of the many destinations in the heart of our city will be able to leave their bike in a secure bike parking lot while they shop, eat or play.

"As the weather gets warmer, we're excited to offer people more opportunities to walk, bike and roll their way downtown," said Tom Girvan, Director of Downtown Vibrancy and Safe City. "The free bike valet program can be a great tool for people who want to cycle

their way to visit a local business or attend a festival or event this summer."

Located on 100 Street and 102 Avenue, the bike valet can hold up to 19 bikes and will operate on a first-come, first-served basis. Two Hiregood staff members will be onsite during program hours from 11 a.m. until 11 p.m. to help do bike check-ins and check-outs. Hiregood is a social enterprise owned by Boyle Street Community Services, a community organization in Edmonton that provides services to people experiencing homelessness and poverty.

The bike valet program will be open on Saturdays from June 15 to August 24. Cyclists are encouraged to bring their own locks for additional protection.

"The City continually works on programs that support bike education and encouragement, and this valet program is a great addition," said Shewkar Ibrahim, Director of Traffic Operations. "Providing secure bike parking is one way to encourage people of all ages and abilities to explore Edmonton's Active Transportation Network by bike."

The bike valet program is launching during Bike Month, a chance to encourage and celebrate cycling opportunities throughout our city. Edmontonians can explore some fun initiatives to add more active transportation to their commute and leisure, such as City-led ride-alongs, pre-planned cycling Joy Rides and business discounts. Winning art submissions brighten Edmonton's streets

The City of Edmonton installed the 12 winning designs from the Vibrant Streets Art Contest, making our streets more lively and celebrating the rich artistry and culture of our city. Participants submitted stunning pieces of original artwork for potential designs to wrap around decorative traffic control boxes around the city.

"The Vibrant Streets Art Contest launched in August 2023, giving residents the opportunity to share their ideas and creativity through art," said Councillor Andrew Knack, "It also supports the City's goal of transforming public spaces into vibrant, beautiful and inviting places to gather and celebrate diverse communities thriving across Edmonton."

The City received nearly 100 submissions and City staff narrowed it down to 28 finalists for the public to vote on their 12 favourite designs. One winning design has been installed in each City ward.

"The decorative traffic control boxes increase the vibrancy of our City's streets, sidewalks and alleyways," said Jenny Albers, General Supervisor of Planning and Permitting, Traffic Operations. "We're excited to install the winning artwork and showcase the creativity, talent and diversity of city residents."

Winning artist Alaynee Goodwill-Littlechild said of their design, "I wanted to

push the boundaries of my own creativity and contribute to the vibrant cultural fabric of our city. I was drawn to the idea of creating something that can be experienced and enjoyed by people from all walks of life, and that can inspire a sense of wonder, curiosity and connection."

The Vibrant Street programs supports Edmontonians in adding vibrancy to their communities through outdoor patios, decorative crosswalks, alleyways, and traffic control boxes.

Emergency Medical Services



Backyard Play Safety



Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to encourage parents and caregivers to ensure that their backyard play area(s) is made safe for children. Although direct supervision is the best method to reduce the chance of injury, always ensure play equipment in your yard is in good repair and is suited to the age and skill of the children using it. Check the equipment often; replace or repair any worn or broken parts.

Water hazards

- Drowning contributes to unintentional injury-related death among young children.
- Children can drown in just a few centimetres of water if it covers their mouth and nose.
- Ensure all backyard swimming pools are fenced. The fence must be at least 1.8 metres (*) high and have a self-latching, self-closing, lockable gate.
 (*Alberta Building Code)

Lawn and garden tools

- Keep young children away from outdoor power equipment.
- Serious burns may result from touching hot engine surfaces.
- Ensure that all sharp tools, fuel, chemicals, and other hazardous substances are stored in a secure, locked area. A simple latch may not be sufficient.

Insect bites and stings

- Minimize the risk of attracting insects by not wearing strong perfumes or scented lotions.
- Avoid wearing brightly coloured clothing outdoors.
- Consider destroying or relocating hives and nests situated near your home.
- To avoid injury through inadvertently stepping on a stinging insect, always wear footwear outdoors.
- If your child has received an 'EpiPen Junior' prescription from your physician (for anaphylactic reactions) ensure they understand when and how to use it.
- If your child experiences a severe reaction to an insect sting, or other environmental cause, seek medical attention, or call 9-1-1.


