How to begin?

Local branches of the Edmonton Public Library offer books you can read with your child that help you begin to talk about Indigenous culture. Consider "You Hold Me Up" by Indigenous author Monique Gray Smith, a lovely picture book that shares stories of kindness, compassion, and respect. Another good choice? "Wild Berries," by Metis and Cree writer and Illustration

tor Julie Flett. As you follow along with a young boy, Clarence, who picks wild blueberries with his grandmother, you learn Cree words in the unfolding story. Ask the librarian to suggest other books, as well.

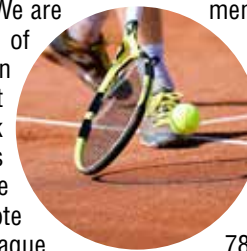
