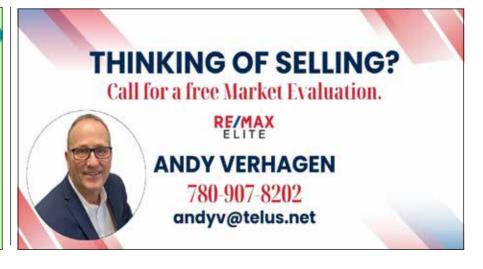

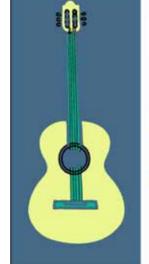

New Board Member: Gail Gravelines

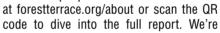

Project Update: Dawson Bridge Rehabilitation

The Dawson Bridge will undergo minor rehabilitation work to strengthen the bridge piers. Construction was initially scheduled to begin earlier, but the timeline has been adjusted to start later this Fall and wrap up by Spring 2026. The delay is connected to the Low Level Bridge closure, which allows crews to take advantage of lower water levels in the colder winter months. making the work more efficient. We expect this project to have minimal impact on traffic. with only occasional weekend closures of the bridge. Pedestrian and cyclist access will remain open, with one side of the shared-use pathway anticipated to stay accessible throughout construction. We will share additional details, including detours. closer to the start date.

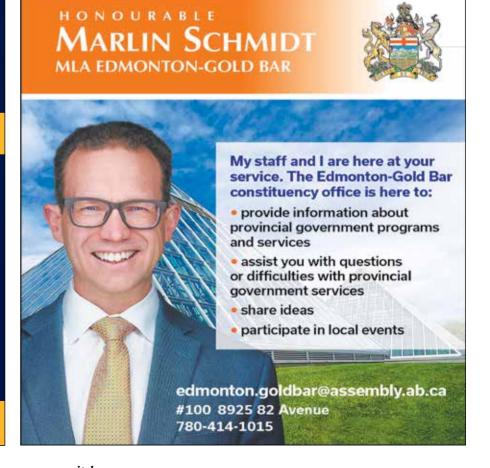

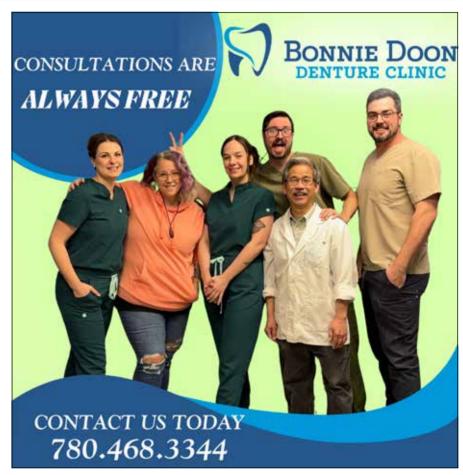

Holyrood Golden Homes Update

The demolition work is anticipated to be completed in Fall 2025. The work will involve hazardous materials abatement, as well as demolition of the existing buildings and removal of utilities on the property. During the demolition project, nearby residents may experience increased noise levels and traffic due to the nature of the work. Most of the demolition activities will take place between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. in accordance with the Community Standards Bylaw 14600. Steps will be taken to reduce dust and minimize noise for residents and businesses. Before the demolition work starts, fencing will go up around the perimeter of the property. The City is working to reduce demolition impacts while keeping residents and business owners informed. If you have questions or concerns, please contact the Project Manager at FacilityInfrastructureDelivery@edmonton.ca.

Next Steps

Once the demolition project is complete, the City will list the property for non-market sale on its property listing website and invite affordable housing developers to submit proposals based on City affordable housing development guidelines. The type of affordable housing built on the site will depend on the development proposals received.

Golden Homes played an important role in the community by providing affordable housing for seniors for many years. The site will continue to offer safe, adequate and affordable housing in the future. The redevelopment is part of the City's efforts to create approximately 4,700 new or refurbished affordable housing units between 2023 and 2026.

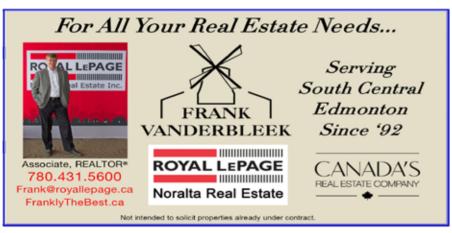

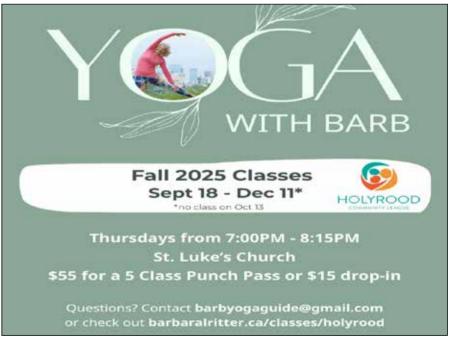

Ottewell Neighbourhood Renewal - Construction Update September 2025

The third year of Ottewell Neighbourhood Renewal construction is underway! Work will consist of removal and replacement of sidewalks, curbs, gutters and street lights as well as reconstruction and paving of the roads and all associated landscaping. Drainage infrastructure work, including Low Impact Development (LID) structures, is well underway. Sidewalk installation near the LID facilities is progressing, and the backfill of the LIDs is proceeding ahead of road rehabilitation. Street light installations are progressing. The contractor is positioning new street lights as close to property lines as possible.

Upcoming road closures (Please note,

all timelines may change, depending on weather conditions):

After September 27: 95 Avenue (east of 67A Street), 68A Street continuing to 96A Avenue and the 98 Avenue service road (west of 64 Street)

For those who live in the 2023/2024 construction areas, the landscaping deficiencies have begun. Landscaping work is highly dependent on weather and sod availability. Ottewell Flood Mitigation Project - Dry Pond

JULY 2025



EPCOR is constructing a dry pond in Ottewell Park, while dry the vast majority of the time and are designed to temporarily hold stormwater when the drainage system cannot, and help prevent flooding of roads, properties and sewer backups in basements.

Residents can expect to see the contractor use a combination of excavators, loaders, skid steers, and tandem trucks. as well as other equipment. There will be an increased presence of tandem trucks and other construction equipment entering and exiting the site.

Use of the laydown area in Ottewell Park began the week of July 7, 2025. Once final permits and agreements are in place, dry pond construction will begin. It is expected that dry pond construction will be complete in December 2025.

All affected landscaping, pavements and sidewalks will be restored to their original condition. Landscaping restorations will be completed in spring 2026, as weather permits. Please note, these timelines are estimates and may change based on weather, progress and construction conditions.

Safety of both the public and work crews is EPCOR's top priority during construction. Due to the close proximity of the dry pond construction to Braemar School and St. Brendan Catholic School. material hauling is restricted during school drop-off and pick-up hours.

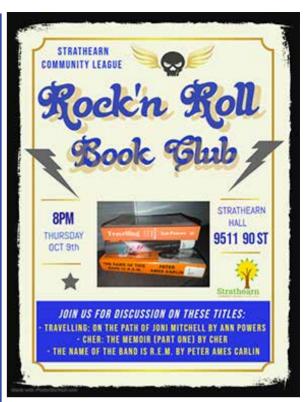

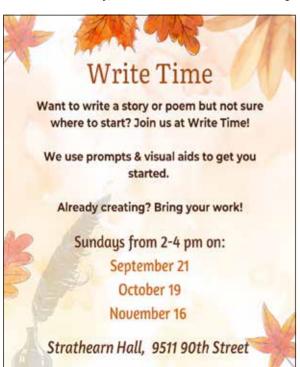
